

Grawemeyer Award in Education

Diana Hess & Paula McAvoy were awarded the 2017 University of Louisville Grawemeyer Award in Education for their 2014 book *The Political Classroom: Evidence and Ethics in Democratic Education* which explores the role of teachers in perpetuating serious, thoughtful deliberation in schools.

The book is based on a four-year study of 35 teachers and their 1,000-plus students. Their analysis included 21 schools representing all points on the political spectrum. Hess and McAvoy provided compelling case studies that showcased the power of the deliberative process in helping students hone thinking, reasoning and communication skills as they examined the question: "How should we live together?"

CEHD Signature Partnerships

The Signature Partnership is a University effort to enhance the quality of life and economic opportunity for residents of West Louisville.

Dr. Harrie Buecker, Liaison for School and District Partnerships and ELEOD Clinical Assistant Professor, coordinates the Signature Partnership Initiative (SPI) for the College of Education and Human Development. She also serves as the CEHD representative for the University's Community Engagement Steering Committee and Faculty Liaisons Committee that works to address the quality of life issues affecting the west end community.

SPI seeks to:

- Elevate educational attainment
- Foster economic empowerment
- Build capacity for social and human services
- Improve health and quality of life

What is SPI up to?

An integral part of the CEHD Signature Partnership is the clinical model teacher preparation program, which was established through funds from the Mary K. Oxley Foundation. The first clinical model site was located at J.B. Atkinson and has expanded to now include Portland Elementary, Westport Middle, Cochran Elementary, and The Academy at Shawnee. The Oxley funds also support professional development for teachers in SPI schools, including National Board Certification. They also support summer enrichment activities in these schools.

Recently, the Signature Partnership also received funding support from Follett, the new campus bookstore partner. They will be providing the Signature Partnership and affiliate schools with a \$5,000 award for the next 15 years. This money will be used to purchase supplies for the classrooms and students at these schools.
