### DEPARTMENT PRIORITIES (2004-2005)

#### Priority 1: Increase research productivity

##### **Base**

- Increase number of publications submitted to 0.75 per faculty member per year.
- Increase number of grants and contracts submitted to 7 per two years.
- Increase number of publications with students or alumni to 2.

##### **Intermediate**

- Increase number of publications submitted to 0.95 per faculty member per year.
- Increase number of grants and contracts submitted to 9 over two years.
- Increase number of publications with students or alumni to 3.

##### **High**

- Increase number of publications submitted to 1 per faculty member per year.
- Increase number of grants and contracts submitted to 10 per two years.
- Increase number of publications with students or alumni to 4.

#### Priority 2: Further develop the department's Diversity Initiatives

##### **Base**

- Increase faculty or staff diversity by 1 new hire as positions become available
- Increase diversity of students majoring in geography by 10%.

##### **Intermediate**

- Increase number of minority students majoring in geography by 15%

##### **High**

- Increase number of minority students majoring in geography by 25%

#### Priority 3: Establish and Improve Partnerships and Collaborative Programs

##### **Base**

- Increase the number of collaborative programs with local high schools by 25%
- Initiate partnerships with metropolitan area businesses, community-based organizations, or state and regional agencies by establishing 1 such partnership

##### **Intermediate**

- Increase the number of collaborative programs with local high schools by 50%
- Increase partnerships with metropolitan area businesses, community-based organizations or state and regional agencies by establishing 1 additional partnership.

**High**

- Increase the number of collaborative programs with local high schools by 75%.
- Increase partnerships with metropolitan area businesses, community-based organizations or state and regional agencies by 1 partnership.
