Chair Updates: Other comments included:

- Chairman Brown attended the Divine Nine (9) NPHC celebration on April 21, 2012;
- He also attended the African American Graduation ceremony on May 10 at the J.B. Speed Museum;
- Met with the Chairs Council (consisting of Faculty Senate, Staff Senate, Commission on the Status of Women and CODRE) on April 24. Faculty Senate Vice Chair, Joseph Steffen has been elected to succeed Chair, Robert Staat. At the meeting, Staff Senate Chair David James announced that he does not plan to run for re-election. The group discussed budget matters, RIF (reduction in force) and their concerns departments would use as a format to terminate employees. Also discussed was graduation rates and enrollment in professional schools. COSW Chair Valerie Casey talked about the upcoming College Women Leadership Conference to be held in May 31 through June 2;

<u>Minutes</u>: A motion to approve the minutes from May 11 was made by Nancy Barr. Her motion was seconded by Dewey Clayton and passed after vote.

<u>CET</u>: Two goals: Examine the results of the Campus Climate Survey. The other goal is to work out what to do about the flyers. Undesirable flyers are found around campus from time to time. The language of those flyers is becoming more aggressive. University counsel attended the meeting to advise what could be done legally. Discussion –

- CET will work with people who monitor the bulletin boards. The College of Education is doing a good job of sweeping;
- will talk with Blaine Hudson about A&S units and departments. Units must do a better job of monitoring;

<u>Diversity Programming Update</u>: Thirty programs were funded this year. Fannie Cox is trying to obtain 8 evaluations from units who were awarded funding so that the information can be included in her year-end report. Guidelines for CODRE sponsorship are currently being amended. Diversity Chair Cox plans on sending a letter to all participants about *new* applications.

<u>Faculty Concerns</u>: This past month the winner of the Graduate Research Award was selected. Faculty Concerns Chair, Jp Mohsen also reported that he presented to the Faculty Senate.

<u>Staff Concerns</u>: Staff Concerns is forming a liaison with Great Place to Work (GPTW). They will get the word out about the listsry. Patus is stepping down as Chair of Staff Concerns. She is willing to stay on the committee but does not have the time to commit to chairing the group. Also, Valerie Browning who serves on Staff Concerns, has completed her term on CODRE.

Student Engagement: The Student Engagement Committee has a new member, Katy Adamchik. Team SEC has plans to meet with students and inform them of the proper way to access student funding.

<u>COSW Update</u>: The COSW held an election to replace one of their Executive Committee members; Dr. M. Cindi Logsdon's term expired on June 30. Dr. Brenda Hart was elected to fill Cindi's seat. The COSW is working in collaboration with the VPBA, Women's Center and with program support from the Delphi Center planning *Pathways*, a Women's Leadership Workshop to be held May 17, 2013. The one-day *Pathways Workshop* is patterned after the Women's Leadership Institute.

LGBT: Taylor-Archer announced that Brian Buford, Director of LGBT Services is in Spain. Join Brian in his walk by doing 30 minutes a day. The walk is an initiative of *Get Healthy Now*.

Staff Senate: Staff Senate will hold elections in August. Dhiane Bradley is running unopposed for the chair's seat. David Jones has stepped down. The new Faculty Senate Chair is Joe Steppen.
