

University faculty and administrators received a total of 91 grants totaling \$12,779,460 during the 2015-16 academic year*. The grants addressed a variety of issues in the community including training and education, research, project assessment and direct services. Some of the top units to receive funding include the School of Medicine, the Kent School of Social Work, the School of Public Health and Information Sciences (SPHIS), and the College of Education and Human Development (CEHD). Of the total amount awarded \$4,371,304 either directly or indirectly impacted the Signature Partnership Initiative area of west Louisville.
