

Kentucky residents may also be given additional consideration if they meet criteria for being “disadvantaged” as follows:

A “disadvantaged applicant” is defined as one who cannot compete on an equitable basis, using standard criteria for acceptance to Dental School and/or has not had equal educational opportunity. Each of the following criteria indicates a disadvantaged applicant:

- Parental education: both parents with high school education or less.
- Graduated from a high school in a non-metropolitan county (all counties except Boone, Bourbon, Boyd(Ashland),Bracken, Bullitt, Campbell(Cincinnati), Clark, Fayette(Lexington), Gallatin, Grant, Greenup, Henderson, Henry, Jefferson(Louisville), Jessamine, Kenton(Cincinnati), Meade, Nelson, Oldham, Pendleton, Scott, Shelby, Spencer, Trimble, Webster and Woodford.)
- English spoken as a second language
