GENERAL PRACTICE RESIDENCY PROGRAM ORAL SURGERY ROTATION OBJECTIVES

EDUCATIONAL OBJECTIVES FOR THE ORAL SURGERY ROTATION:

- 1) Evaluate and diagnose acute and/or chronic dental pathology;
- 2) Determine appropriate dental treatment based on an accurate diagnosis and patient assessment;
- 3) Understand the principles and techniques necessary to perform routine dentoalveolar surgery and manage complications by performing:
 - a. uncomplicated and surgical exodontia procedures for all erupted teeth;
 - b. exodontias on third molar soft tissue impactions;
 - c. soft tissue biopsies;
 - d. simple pre-prosthetic surgery.
- 4) Gain knowledge in intravenous and inhalation sedation under the supervision of the Chief Resident/faculty;
- 5) Gain knowledge in the management of patients admitted to the hospital, including preparing the patient record, including notation of medical history, review of physical examination, pre- and post-operative orders, and description of surgical procedures;
- 6) Expose the resident to a variety of more complex oral surgery procedures, including placement of endosseous implants, orthognathic surgery, maxillofacial trauma, etc.

DESCRIPTION OF ORAL SURGERY ROTATION:

Each resident is assigned to the Graduate Oral Surgery program for approximately 8 weeks in two-week intervals. Residents will be under the supervision of the OMFS residents and faculty. Hours TBD.
