The University of Louisville invites applications from and nominations of progressive educators for the position of Dean of the College of Education and Human Development. The University of Louisville has 22,031 students, an operating budget of \$946.3 million, and a total endowment of \$599.7 million. The University of Louisville is a Research High institution. The Dean reports to the University Provost and is responsible for administration of the educational programs of the College of Education and Human Development. The College of Education and Human Development has an enrollment of approximately 3,200 students and includes 85 tenure-track faculty positions in six departments: Educational and Counseling Psychology, Health and Sport Sciences, Leadership, Foundations, and Human Resource Education, Early Childhood and Elementary Education, Middle and Secondary Education, and Special Education. In 2009, the CEHD attracted over \$11 million in external funds to support its leadership role in school partnership, research, and the recruitment of diverse students, staff, and faculty. The College, which is NCATE, State, APA accredited and NASSM and NSCA approved, offers 69 baccalaureate, master's, and doctoral degree programs, and is an active partner in the University's General Education Program. The internationally recognized Grawemeyer Award in Education is awarded on an annual basis to honor creative and important ideas in education. The successful applicant must possess a doctoral degree and be qualified for appointment to the faculty as a tenured full professor with a strong record of scholarship, teaching and service. In addition, the successful candidate should have most of the following:

- A record of effective post-secondary academic and administrative leadership in creating an environment conducive to excellent teaching, research and scholarly activity, and service;
- A record of effective post-secondary academic and administrative leadership in creating an environment conducive to student achievement and satisfaction including preparation of teachers, administrators, counselors, and other professionals;
- A record of successful interaction with faculty, staff, and students and a commitment to shared governance;
- A commitment to continuous assessment, accountability, and accreditation;
- A record of successful collaborations and partnerships with local, regional, and state-wide school districts and officials and/or other community organizations, with either P-20 experience or involvement in P-20 partnerships preferred;
- A demonstrated ability to acquire, manage, and facilitate external funding;
- A demonstrated commitment to diversity and equal opportunity, with experience in urban settings preferred;
- A demonstrated understanding of national initiatives in P-20 education and the ability to represent the University of Louisville effectively in statewide and national dialogues on educational issues;
- A demonstrated understanding of current research on human development as it relates to the preparation and work of educators, counselors, and leaders.;
- An understanding of technology and its application in teaching, research, service, and organizational management;
- A commitment to the mission of a major research university;
- Experience with or commitment to international programs;
- A high standard of professional integrity and a strong sense of professional ethics.

This position is expected to become available July 1, 2011. Salary will be competitive. Applications will be accepted until the position is filled, but the Committee will begin review by December 15, 2010. Identities of the candidates will remain confidential, except for those who are brought to campus.
