They will lead its graduate programs in Counseling Psychology which are evolving to reflect the APA's new focus on combined professional programs. The successful candidate will be expected to have an active, fundable research program, strong intervention/practice knowledge, and excellent administrative and leadership skills. We particularly seek excellent scientist-practitioners with a major focus on the core mission areas of the Department which are to prepare psychologists in the education and prevention sciences and, particularly, in research and intervention as they apply to schooling and education, health promotion/prevention sciences, and community intervention. Strengths are also sought in consultation, assessment, development, diversity, and supervision.

Preferred candidates will have experience working with accrediting bodies such as APA, NCATE, and CACREP and incorporating technology in instructional practices.
