## **PROFESSIONAL EXPERIENCES**

Director, Louisville Writing Project, 1998 to present. Plan and lead professional development programs for one of the largest and most active of the 200 sites in the National Writing Project network. Involves supervision of a cadre of assistant directors of programs ranging from biannual writing mini-conferences to 39-hour open institutes, continuity activities for 700+ teacher members, and a four-week invitational institute in literacy leadership (EDAP 612). Edited *Journal for Literacy Leaders*, a publication designed to promote teachers' professional writing, 2004 to 2012; 2016. Facilitator, Jefferson County Public Schools-UofL Partnership program (Writing Leadership Project), 2006-2008. Earned funding for local site content literacy initiative through competitive grant (2008 to 2012), leading a team of LWP teachers in studying content literacy and leading colleagues in similar studies of practice and student work. Organized the 2009 Urban Sites Network Conference, a national event of an NWP special interest group; engaged 39 local teachers in planning, presenting or facilitating the event and nearly doubled past attendance records. One of 5 sites invited by the National Writing Project to work with the Literacy Design Collaborative, funded by the Gates Foundation, to develop modules around the new Common Core State Standards which illustrate best practices in writing instruction (2010 to present). Engage teachers in writing professional manuscripts about practice (2009 to present). Review continuing funding applications of National Writing Project sites. Serve on site visitation teams to provide assistance to new and struggling sites.

Director, Kentucky Writing Project State Network, 2004 to present. Initiated the now annual state Fall Conference on Schoolwide Literacy. Developed state-funded achievement gap institutes (2005 and 2006), content area literacy academies (2007 and 2008), school-wide literacy planning institutes (2009), and technology academies (2010 and 2011) and facilitated the design, planning, and implementation of these 2- to 5-day workshops, which are held around the Commonwealth. Currently leading two state teams, one focused on the new Common Core Standards (funded by the Gates Foundation) and the other on meeting the needs of English Language Learners.
