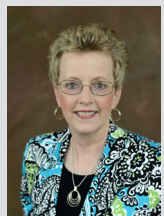

#### McGatha to Present at OVEC

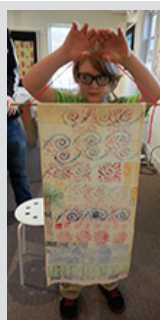

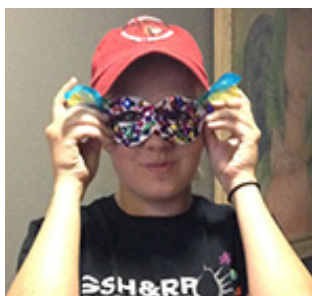
