## MISE Faculty Publish Articles



**Dr. James Chisholm**, Associate Professor in the Department of Middle and Secondary Education (MISE), and **Andrea Olinger**, Assistant Professor in the UofL College of Arts & Sciences' Department of English, published "'She's Definitely the Artist One': How Learner Identities Mediate Multimodal

Composing," in [Research in the Teaching of English](#), the flagship research journal for the National Council of Teachers of English (NCTE). Their article is a discourse analysis that explores the collaborative multimodal composing practices of three 12th grade students as they co-composed paintings in response to their literary readings.

Dr. Chisholm, along with **Dr. Ashley Shelton Arnold**, MISE Instructor, and **Dr. Caroline Sheffield**, Department Chair for MISE, published, "[Mediating Emotive Empathy with Informational Text: Three Students' Think Aloud Protocols of Gettysburg: The Graphic Novel](#)," in the *Journal of Adolescent and Adult Literacy*.
