Washington Conducts PD for JCPS



Ahmad Washington, Assistant Professor in the Department of Counseling and Human Development, recently led a second professional development (PD) presentation on Critical Hip Hop Pedagogy for teachers in Jefferson County Public Schools (JCPS). The PD had such an impact on the group that several teachers and schools are interested in bringing it into their classrooms. Critical Hip Hop Pedagogy is a strategy to engage students, particularly marginalized students, in conversations about social justice. Students are asked to take a critical inventory of the world they live in and determine the extent to which they reinforce the current social hierarchy and status quo. Hip Hop is a perfect medium for this work because it evolved as a radical expression by Black and Puerto Rican people who were fighting systems of oppression and seeking political recognition and social justice.

Jeff Valentine, Professor in the Department of Counseling and Human Development, was an invited speaker at the University of Southern California's Lawrence and Kathleen Ell Symposium that was held in February.
