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#### **Id-Deen Publishes Book Chapter**

Dr. Lateefah Id-Deen, Assistant Professor in the Department of Middle and Secondary Education, published a chapter, "It will help me do better in Mathematics: Building trusting relationships with Black students," in the book, *Access and equity: Promoting high quality Mathematics in grades* 

*6-8.*" The book is published by the National Council of Teachers of Mathematics (NCTM) and offers mathematics educators strategies and resources for putting NCTM's Access and Equity Principle into practice.



#### **Foster Presents at Mayor's Event**

Dr. Eugene Foster, Clinical Associate Professor in the Department of Counseling and Human Development (ECPY), was invited to speak at Louisville Mayor Greg Fischer's Annual Strategic Planning Retreat, which was held at the Speed Museum in August. Dr. Foster presented about ECPY's Cardinal Success Program (CSP),

which is a partner with the Louisville Metro Government's Youth Detention Services. ECPY faculty, graduate and doctoral students work with CSP to provide group counseling services and assist in preparing youth to successfully return to the community and reduce their risk of reoffending. The project began over six months ago and has provided services to more than 200 young people. The partnership is also part of Louisville's Violence Reduction Strategy.



#### SHAPE Selects Vidoni for Strategy Development Group

Dr. Carla Vidoni, Associate Professor in the Department of Health and Sport Sciences, was selected to participate with a group of experts in Health and Physical Education (HPE) to develop a strategy for the Society of Health and Physical Educators (SHAPE) America. The

new strategy will lead to improvement in assessment and data collection in HPE and include a research agenda and evaluation of the 50 Million Strong commitment. The group met in Washington, D.C. in September. Learn more...



#### McCubbin's Research Cited in APA Monitor

The September issue of the *APA Monitor* cited research conducted by Dr. Lali McCubbin, Associate Professor in the Department of Counseling and Human Development, in an article titled, "Maximizing Children's Resilience."

The article examines ways to boost resilience in children who are at risk. Dr. McCubbin's Kauai Study, a longitudinal study that began in 1995 and which she has since taken over as principal investigator, followed up with participants in the study who are now in their 60s. She stated in the article that many of those who took part in the study had created happy, stable lives and drew support from their culture and heritage. Read more...
