ELEOD in the News

Jodi Adams, lecturer and director of the New Career Teacher Institute, was selected as one of 16 research fellows to participate in the [Career and Technical Education \(CTE\) Research Program at North Carolina State University](#), which is sponsored by ECMC Foundation. Jodi is also a graduate of the MAT in Secondary Education program and doctoral student in the educational leadership, and organizational development program.

ELEOD has received Achieve 100! recognition from the Association for Career and Technical Education. This distinction recognizes programs that have full-time faculty, who are actively engaged in CTE. CEHD's CTE program leads Kentucky's New Teacher Institute program, which has educated 232 teachers who are pursuing occupation-based certification. Under ELEOD/CEHD's leadership, the state's New Teacher Institute retention rate has gone from 64.7 percent to 90.4 percent. The CTE program also leads the statewide development for the New Skills for Youth program, which works with the Kentucky Workforce Innovation Board. The CTE program currently has over \$250,000 in external grants and consists of a faculty team:

- **Jodi Adams** - director of the New Teacher Institute
- **Leslie Slaughter**, clinical lecturer - New Skills for Youth Facilitator Leader
- **Mary Stratton** - field-based educator leader
- **Jeffrey Sun**, PhD, chair and professor - Principal Investigator

Leslie Slaughter was invited by Advance CTE to speak at an event hosted by the Committee for Education Funding (CEF), which will be held on Capitol Hill in May. The committee asked that she share her expertise and perspective on the need for increased investment in Career and Technical Education. She will also participate with the committee on visits to members of Congress who represent Kentucky.


