The Department of Educational Leadership, Evaluation, and Organizational Development (ELEOD) seeks candidates for a tenured position in Higher Education Administration who will serve as Program Director.

Duties and Responsibilities

Responsibilities include teaching higher education related courses (both on campus and online); advising and mentoring doctoral students through the completion of dissertations; conducting research and seeking grant funding; leading ongoing program development; participating in governance; and providing service to the college, university, professional associations and discipline-related community partners.

We seek individuals with research interests and professional experience in higher education administration and policy and a demonstrated commitment to envisioning educational success as a continuum. Successful applicants should have teaching and research interests in the study of higher education with preferences in one or more of the following areas: globalization and higher education, community engagement, college teaching, diversity in higher education, community colleges, institutional research, or public policy. A research approach using qualitative or mixed methods is preferred. This program focuses on the study of colleges and universities as organizations and is not a student affairs/student development program.

Required Qualifications

- Successful leadership experience in program development and management
- Demonstrated excellence in scholarly research at the national or international level
- Demonstrated success or the potential for success in teaching in the classroom and online courses in the field of higher education
- Demonstrated commitment to issues of social justice, diversity, and students from multicultural communities and backgrounds
- Demonstrated experience supporting and mentoring master's and doctoral students including directing dissertations
- Demonstrated efforts in supporting and mentoring junior faculty; experience with program development
- Doctoral degree in Higher Education or a closely related field (ABDs not considered)
- Willingness to work collaboratively with other faculty, students, and staff

Preferred Qualifications

- Evidence of successful community engagement in diverse settings
- Administrative experience in higher education
