### Morning Session: Social Skill Interventions and Peer Supports

Participants will explore effective strategies that foster positive peer relationships and support social skill development in children on the autism spectrum. Topics covered include assessment of social functioning, skill acquisition, and peer-mediated interventions. Participants will have an opportunity to collaborate with colleagues and develop a plan to apply the content of the workshop to their current practice.

### Afternoon Session: Literacy Learning for Students with ASD

Developing literacy skills is critical to success in school, employment, and community environments. Yet literacy instruction has not always been a priority for students with autism spectrum disorders. This workshop will include strategies to introduce literacy activities to students with emerging communication skills and strategies to teach Reading First's key literacy components to students with functional communication skills. Lesson planning and progress monitoring will be addressed. Participants will have an opportunity to collaborate with colleagues and develop a plan to apply the content of the workshop to their current practice.
