DESCRIPTION OF FIELD COMPONENT	
Number and Distribution of Hours in the Field	Five different, 3 hour observations are required for a total of 15 hours. The five different observations correspond to the five different developmental periods discussed in the class (e.g., early childhood, late adolescence, etc.).
Purpose(s) of Field Experiences	Candidates observe, take field notes and assist individuals and small groups as requested by Cooperating Teacher (s). Candidates are looking for examples of typical and atypical physical, cognitive, emotional/social/moral, and language development as well as racial/cultural development.
Hallmark Assessment Task (HAT) (only if Field based)	N/A
Description of field-based assignments assessed in course (other than HAT)	Dispositions Assessment; Student Log of Field Experiences hours. Students are to complete five different Field Experience Observation Reflections (FEOR). In the FEOR, students are required to observe terminology from the text and lecture within the classroom environment.

Cooperating Teacher Role and Required Support	Identify appropriate opportunities for candidates to assist individuals and small groups. Cooperating Teachers sign student log of field experiences form.
