

UofL Embargo of Electronic Theses and Dissertations

- Graduate Students and their faculty advisor may request to embargo the release of their thesis or dissertation for 6 months starting on the student’s graduation date.
- The Dean of the School of Interdisciplinary and Graduate Studies must approve each embargo request.
- Reasonable justification for requesting an embargo includes, for example, patent protection or copyright issues.
- The following form should be completed and signed by both the faculty and student, and a PDF of the completed form sent to Courtney Kerr at the time of submission of the thesis or dissertation.
