Although once considered a rare disorder, a recent survey by the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention found that 1 in 91 children had an Autism Spectrum Disorder within examined communities. The dearth of beneficial therapeutic interventions in autism has been accompanied by an efflorescence of classifications and screening scales that lack in construct validity. This course will review recent pragmatic research whose findings generalize to the clinical population.
