### ABOUT THE FACTBOOK

This document contains information and statistics in the content areas of degrees, students, faculty, staff, budget, grants and contracts, libraries, development and alumni, and physical facilities.

### HIGHLIGHTS

- Enrollment headcount in Fall 2008 is 21,761
- Students enrolled full-time represent 73.6% of the student population
- Jefferson County residents represent 47.2% of all students, and Kentucky residents represent 79.3%
- Out-of-state students are 20.6% of enrollment and persons from foreign countries are 5.4%
- Women are a majority at the University, accounting for 51.9% of enrollment
- Minority students, not including international students, represent 16.3% of the University's population
- 4,324 degrees were awarded in 2007-08
- 59% of the University's alumni reside in Kentucky
- UofL has a faculty of 2,124 of which 73% are full-time
- UofL employs a staff of 4,050 of which 86.7% are full-time
- The University's total budget is \$934.6 million
- The University library contains 2,088,566 volumes and 26,808 serials

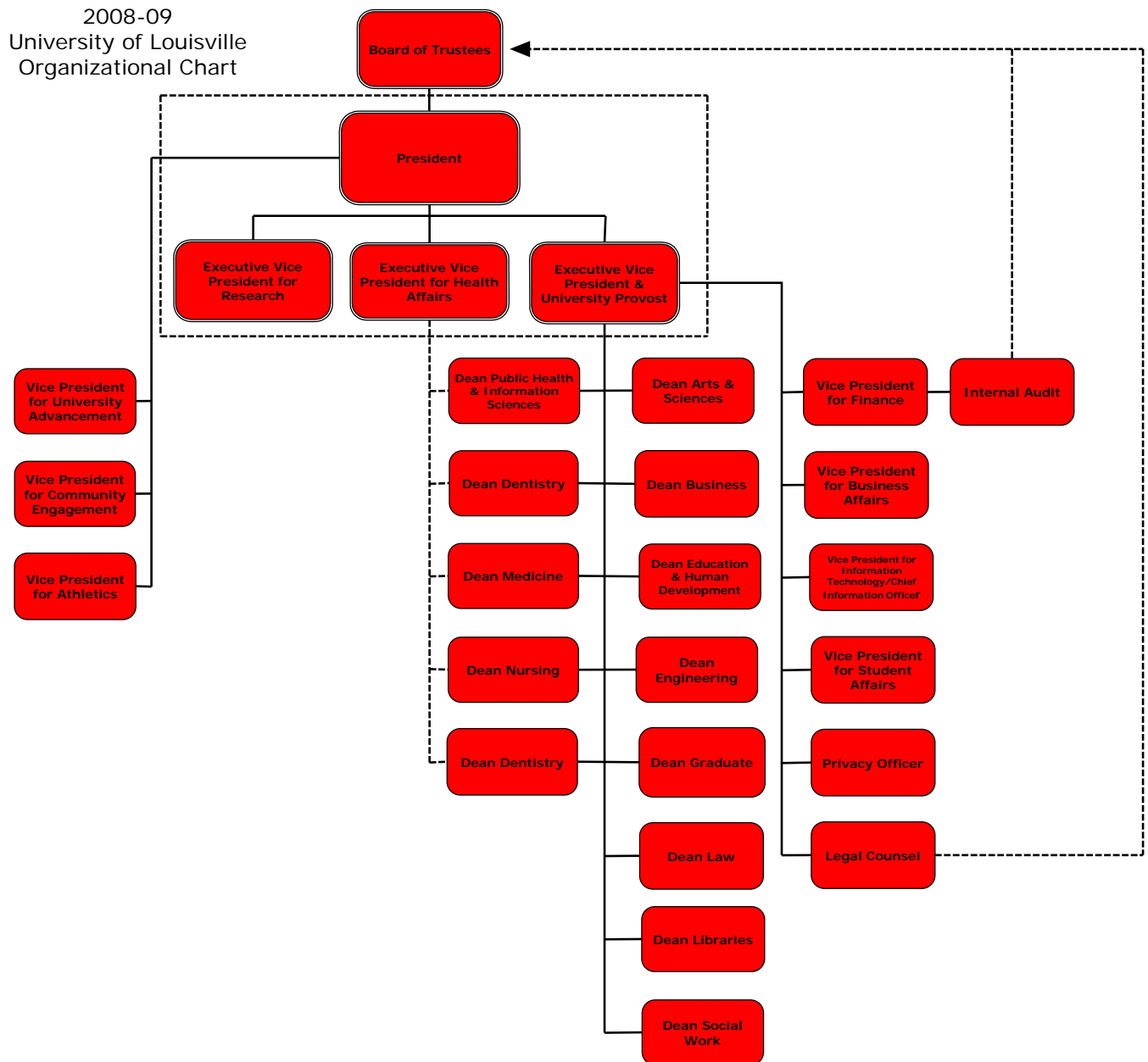

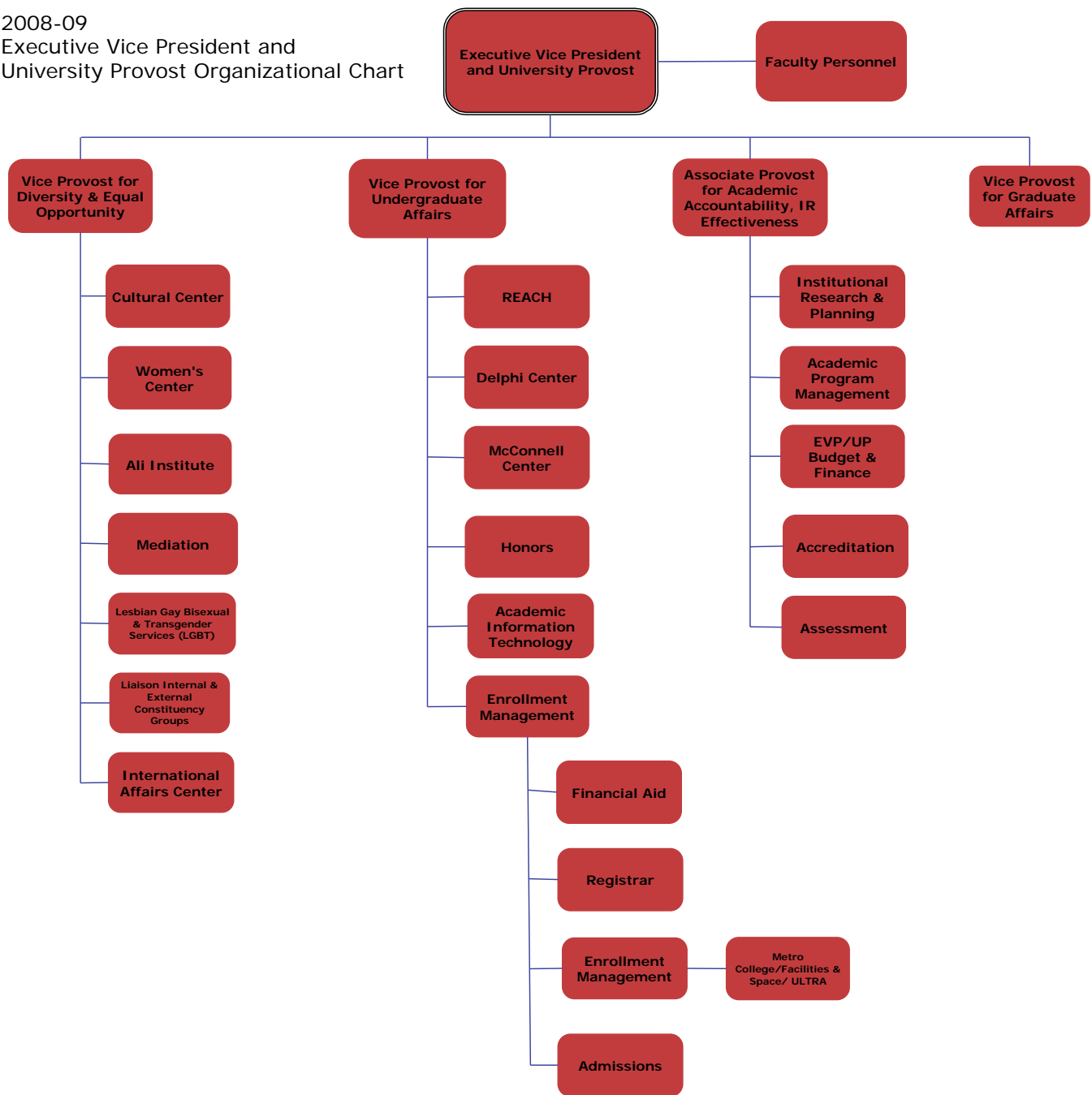

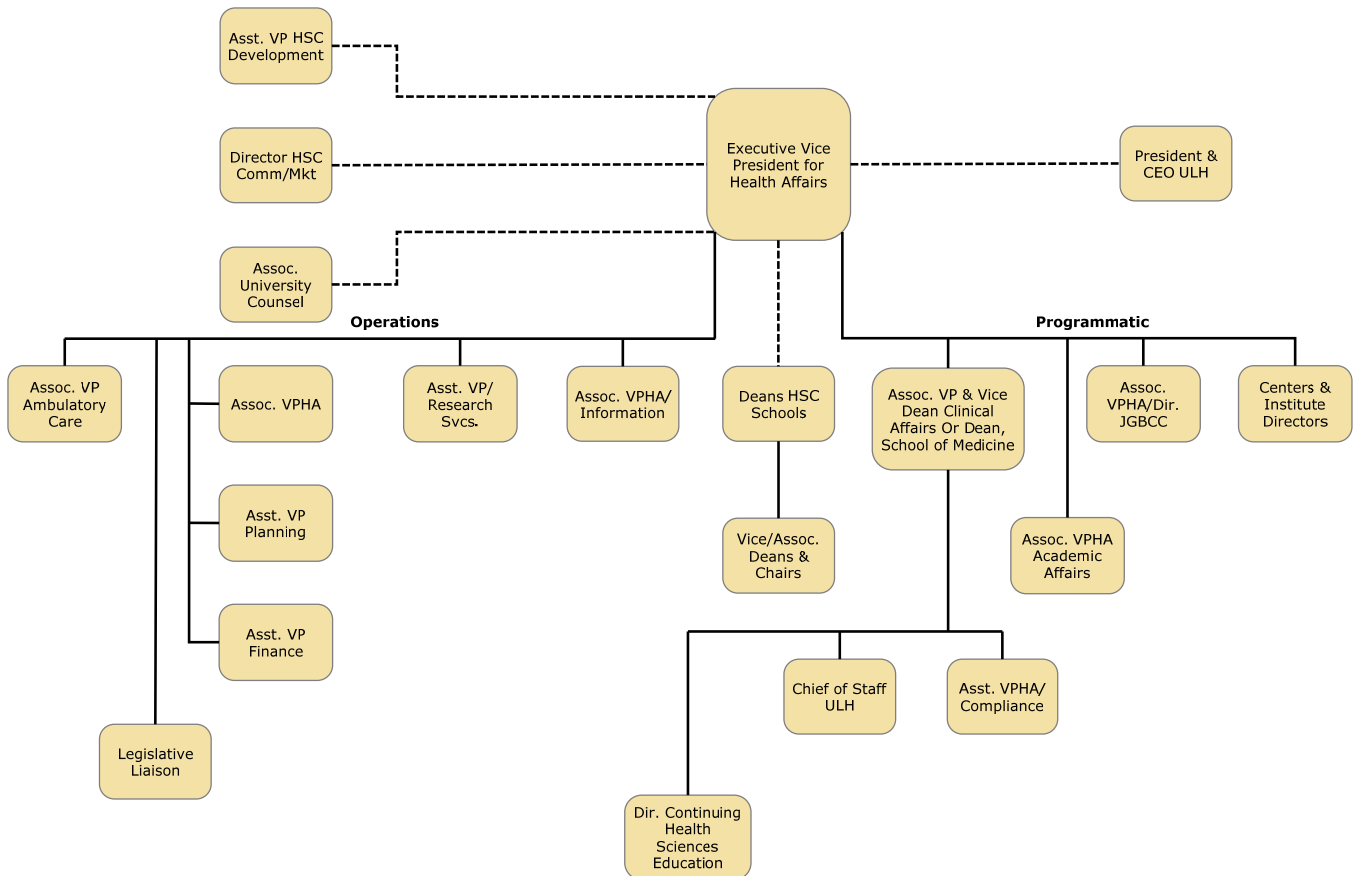

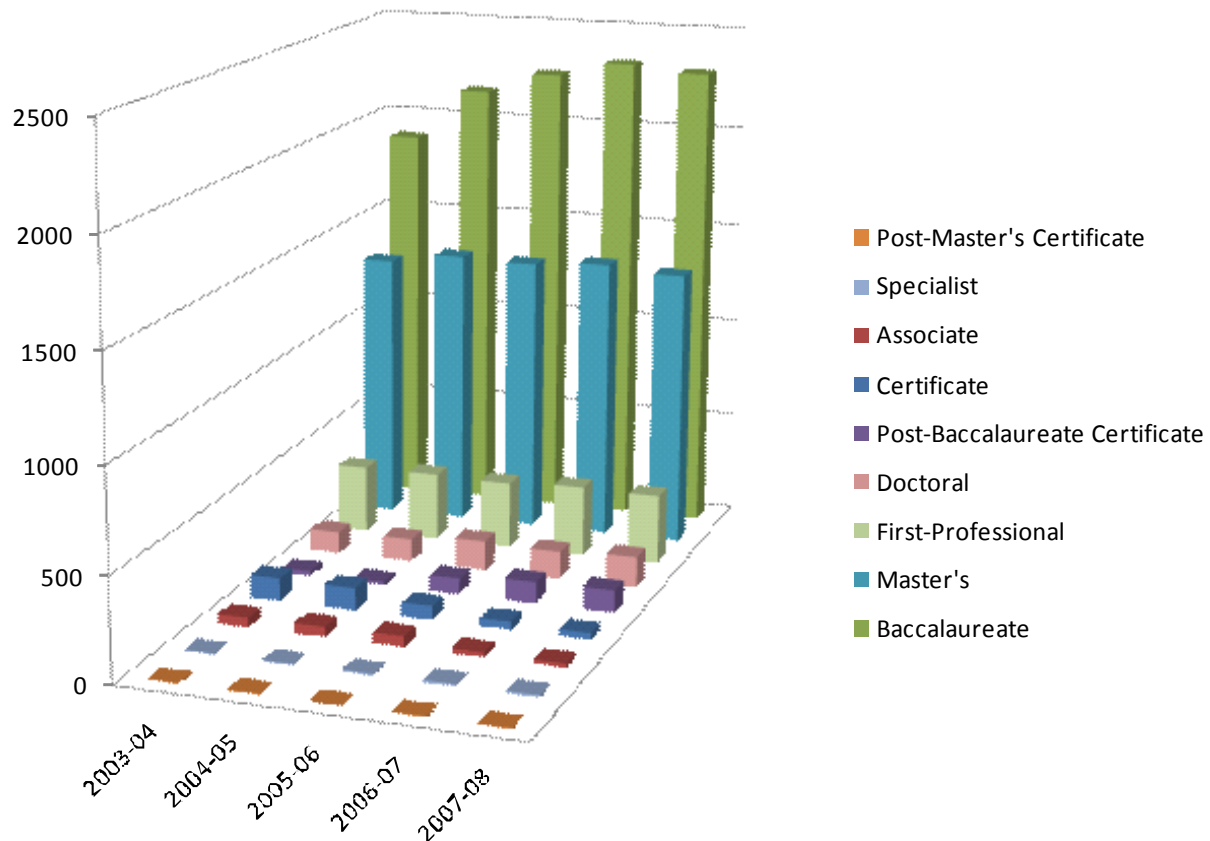

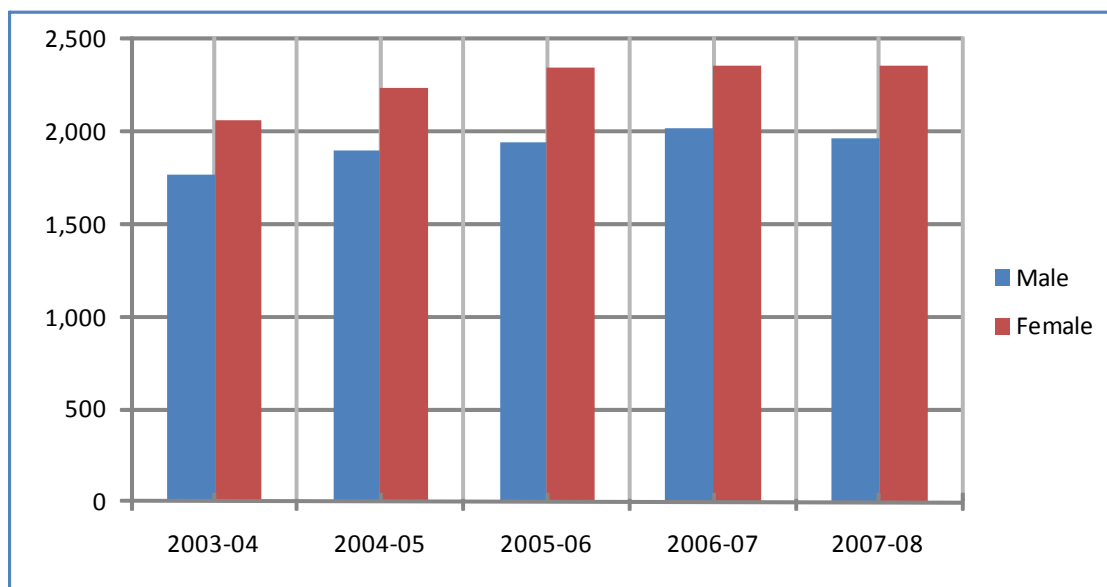

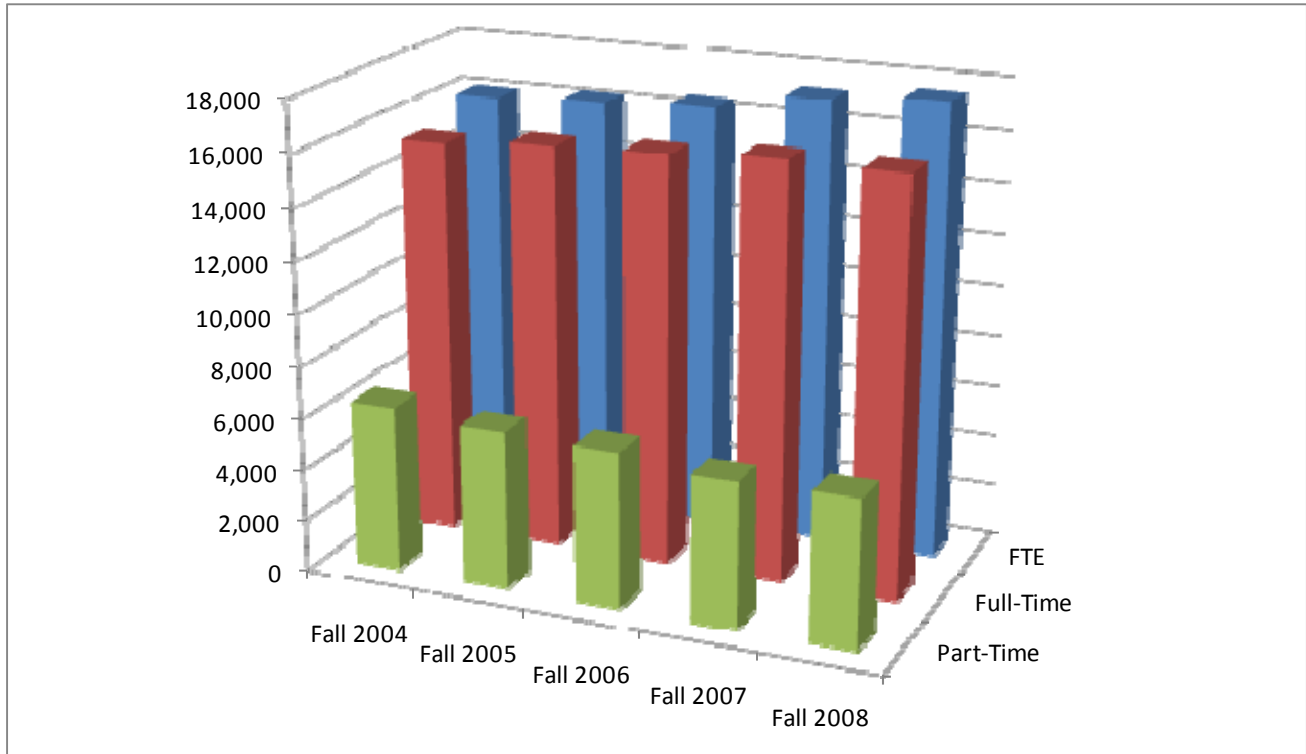

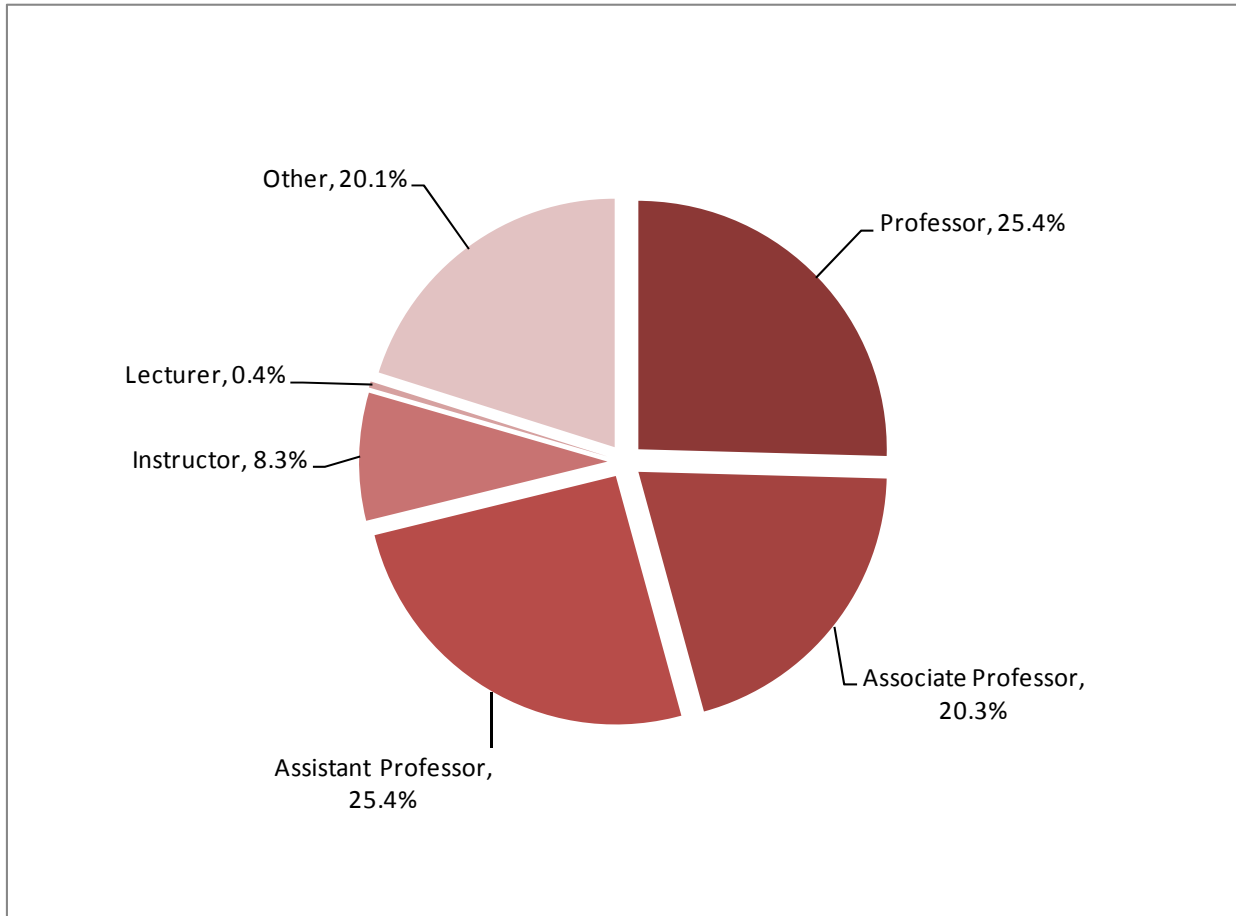

## Faculty by Job Category Fall 2008



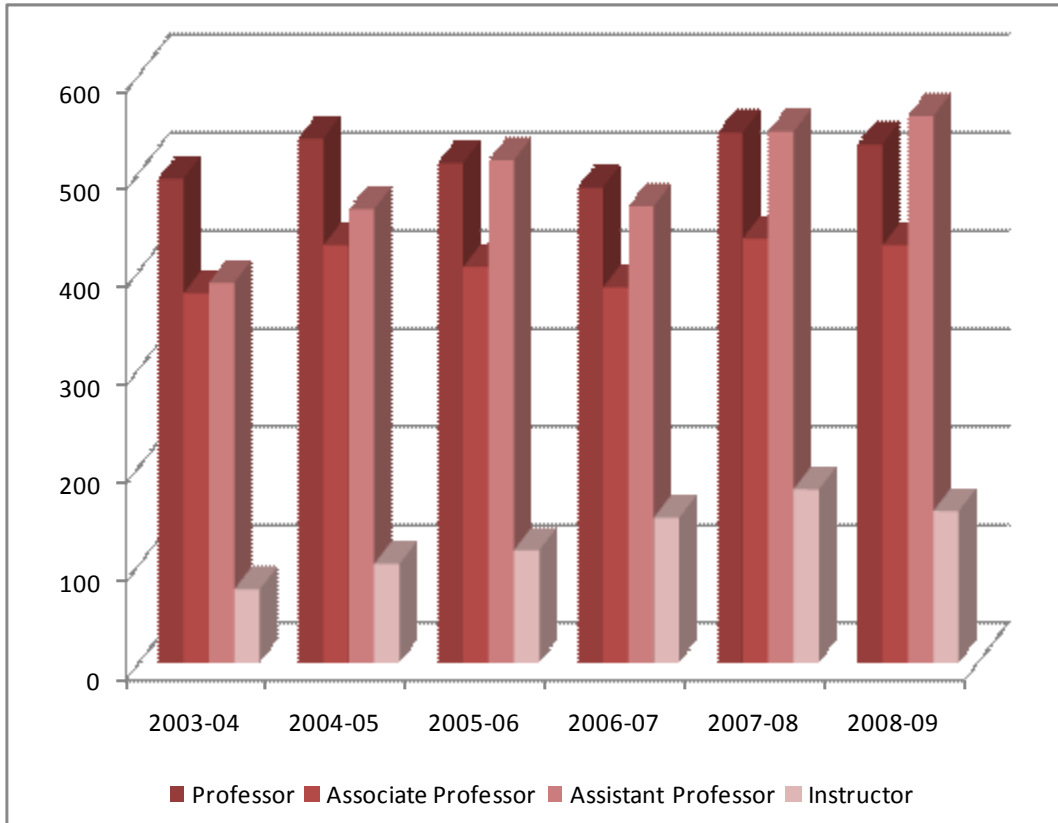

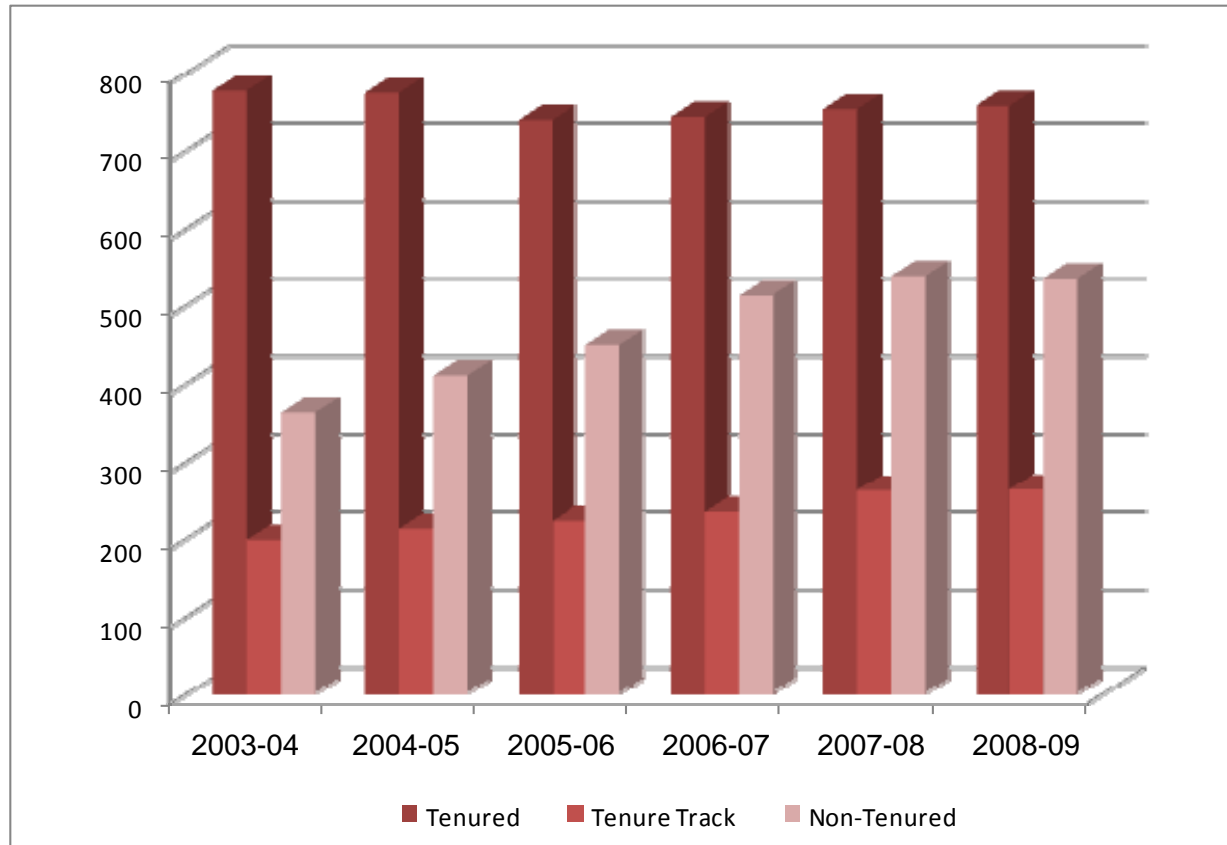

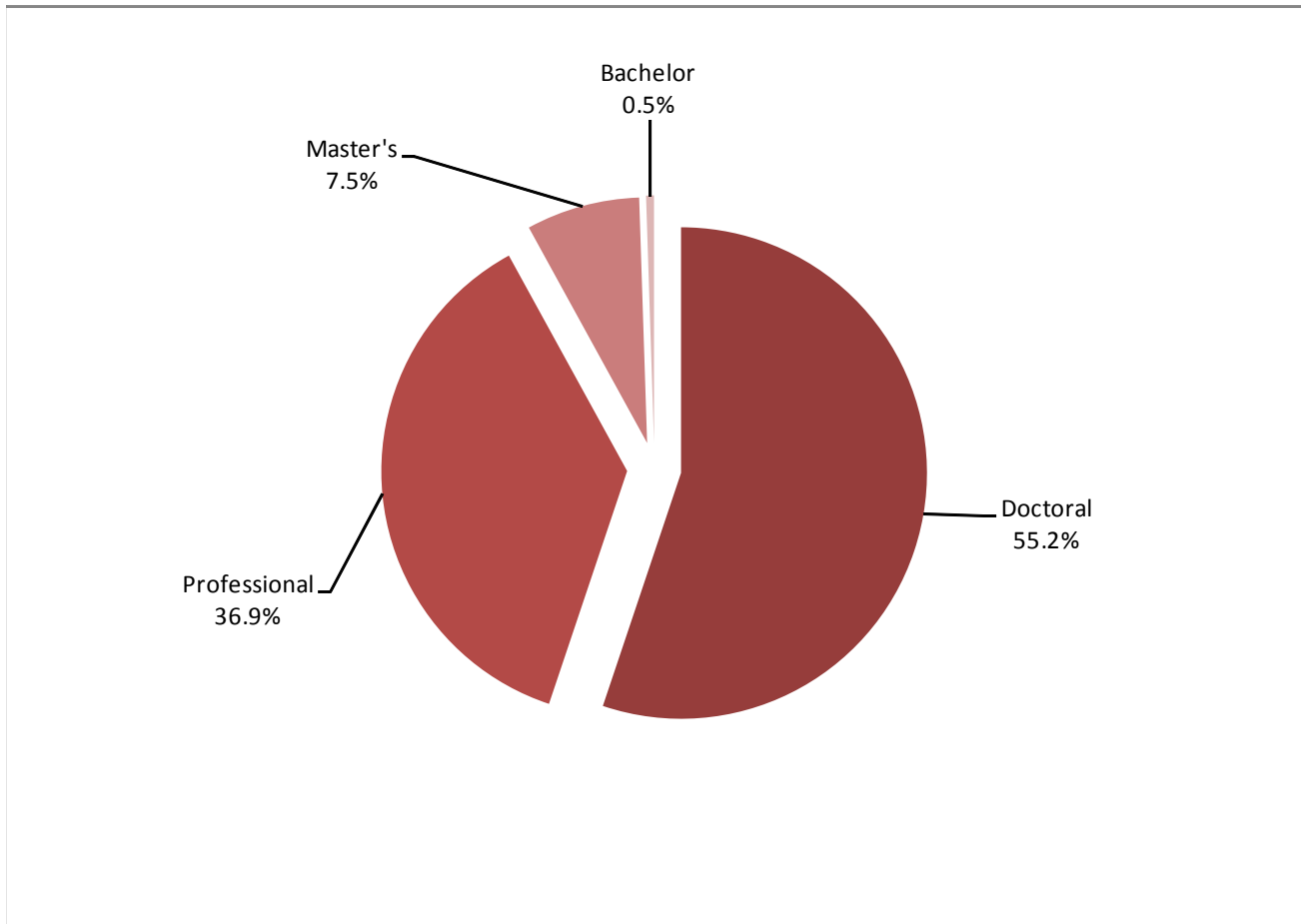

## Highest Degree Earned by Full-Time Faculty Fall 2008



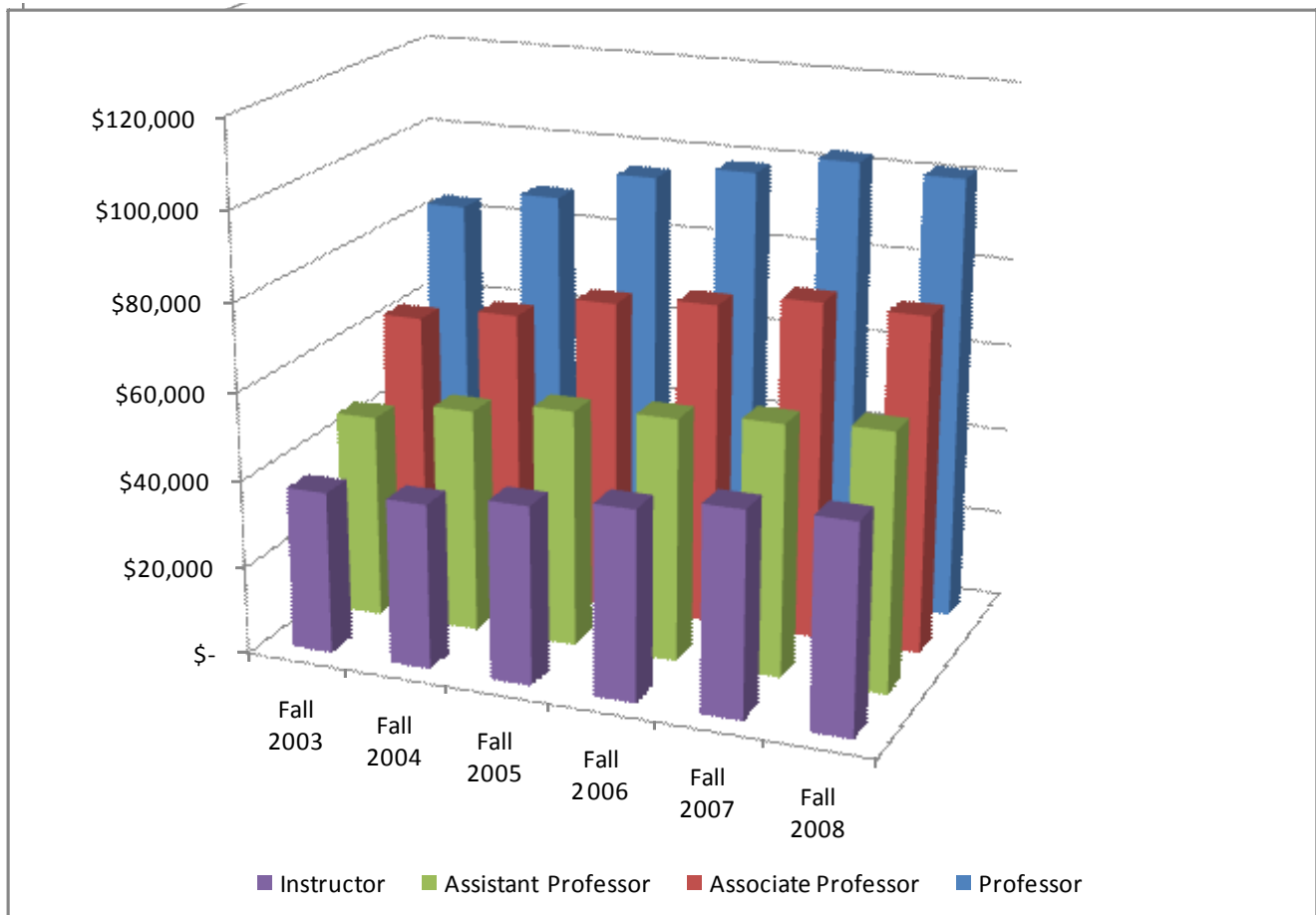

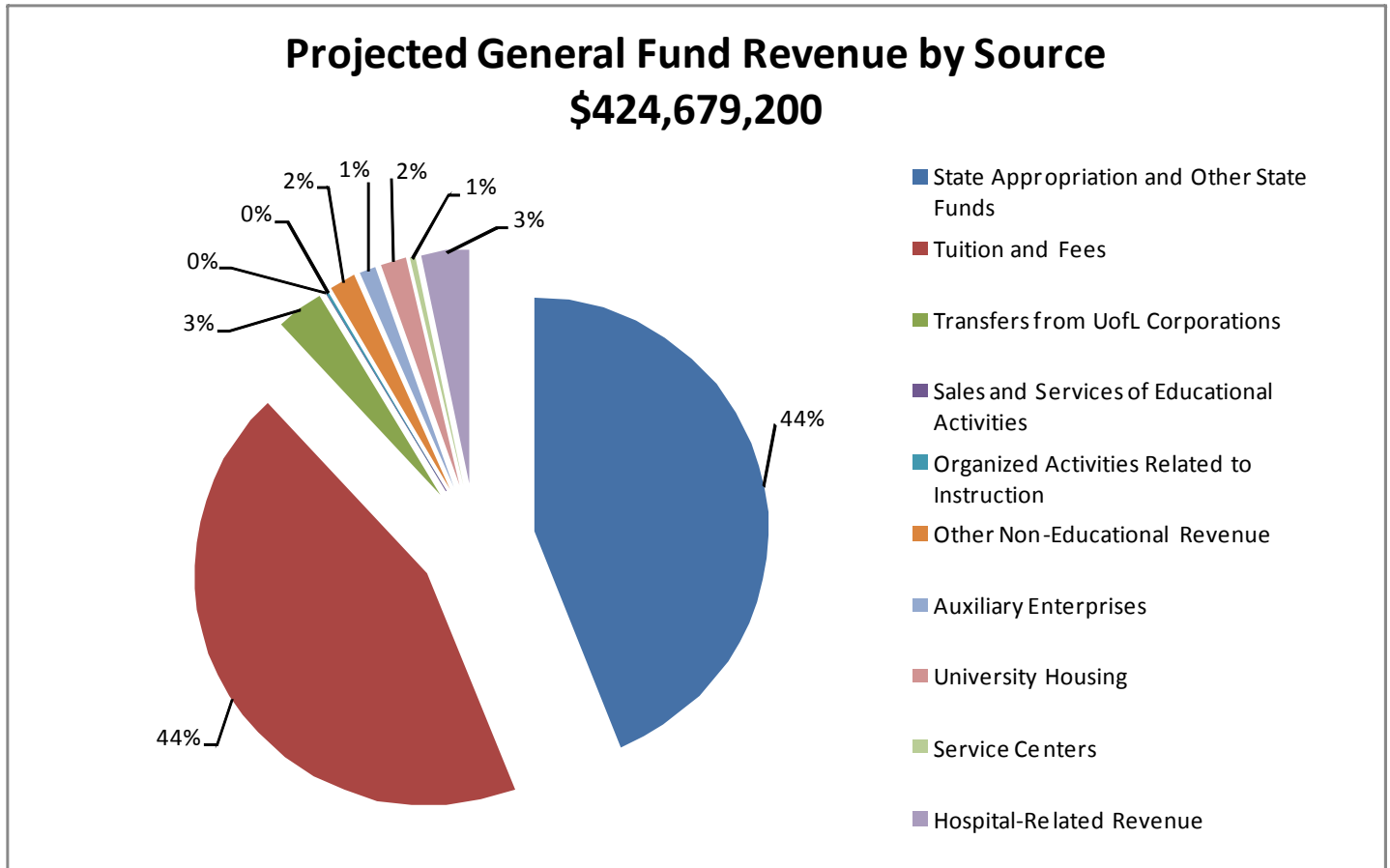

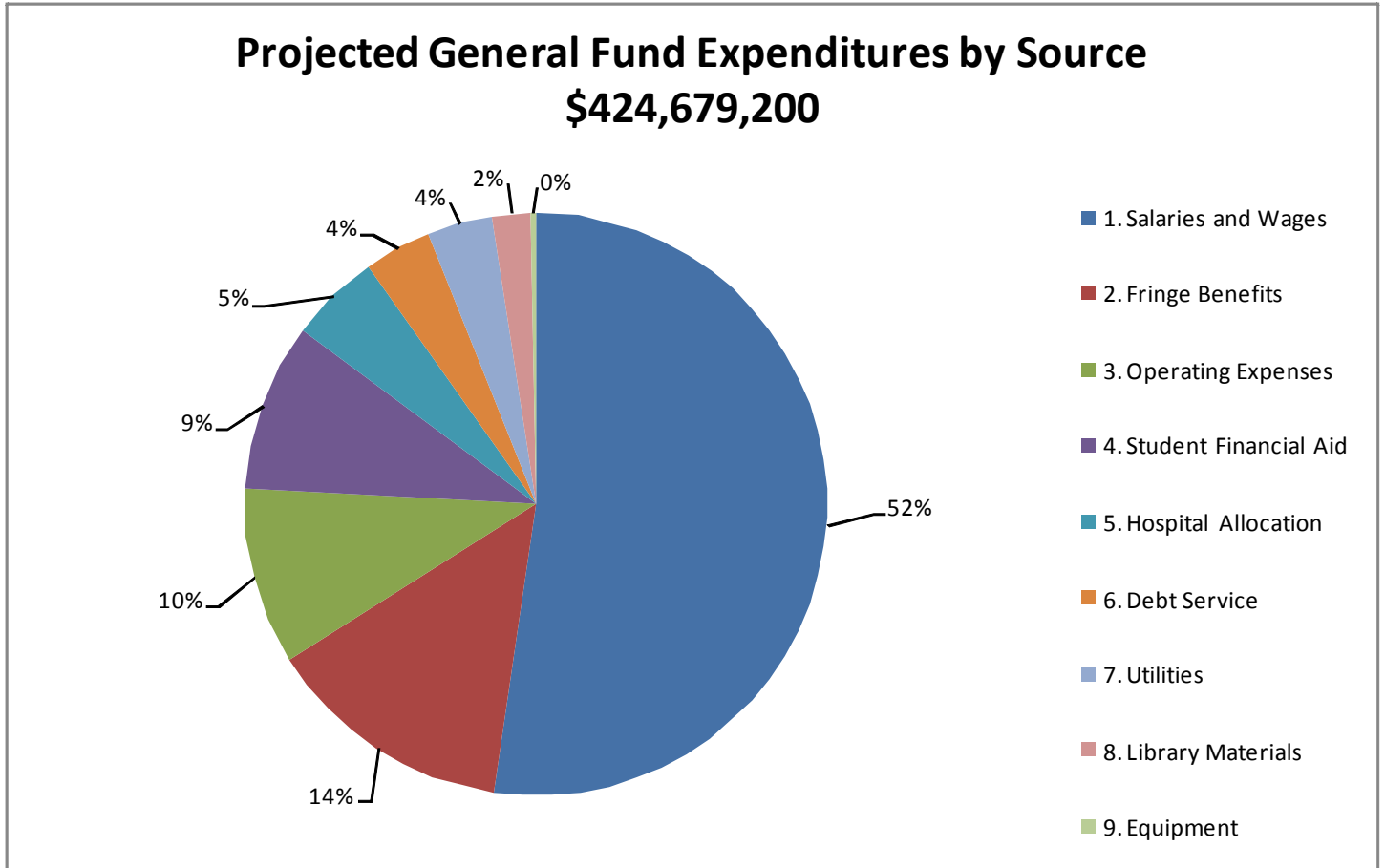
## Budgeted Revenue FY 2008-09

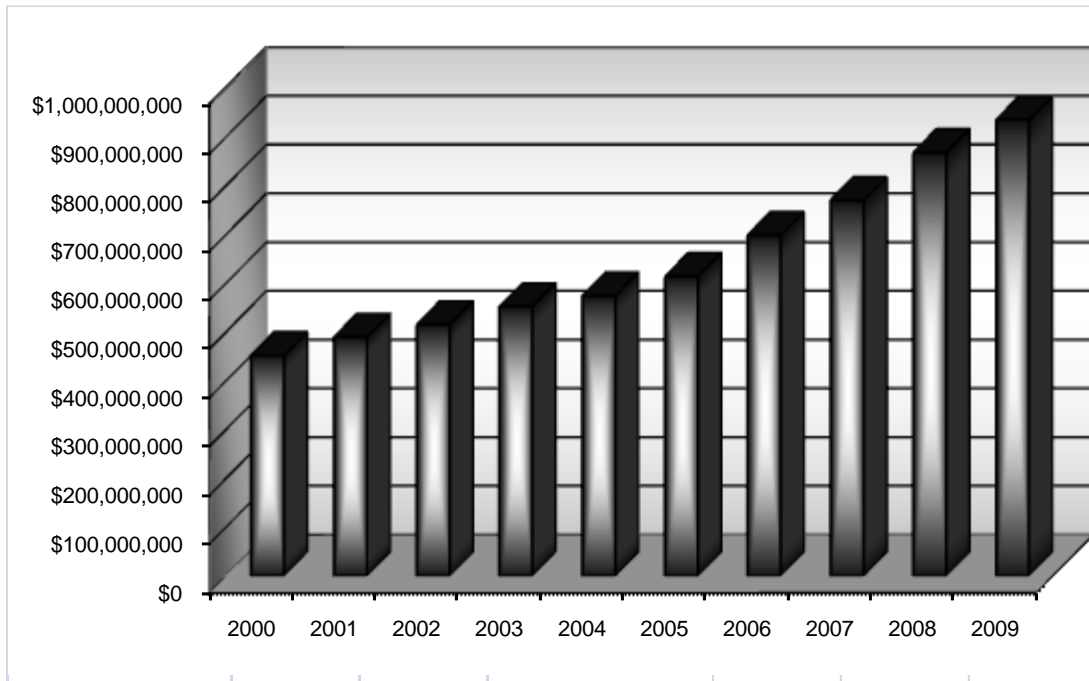

## Ten-Year Budgeted Revenue FY 1999-2000 through 2008-09



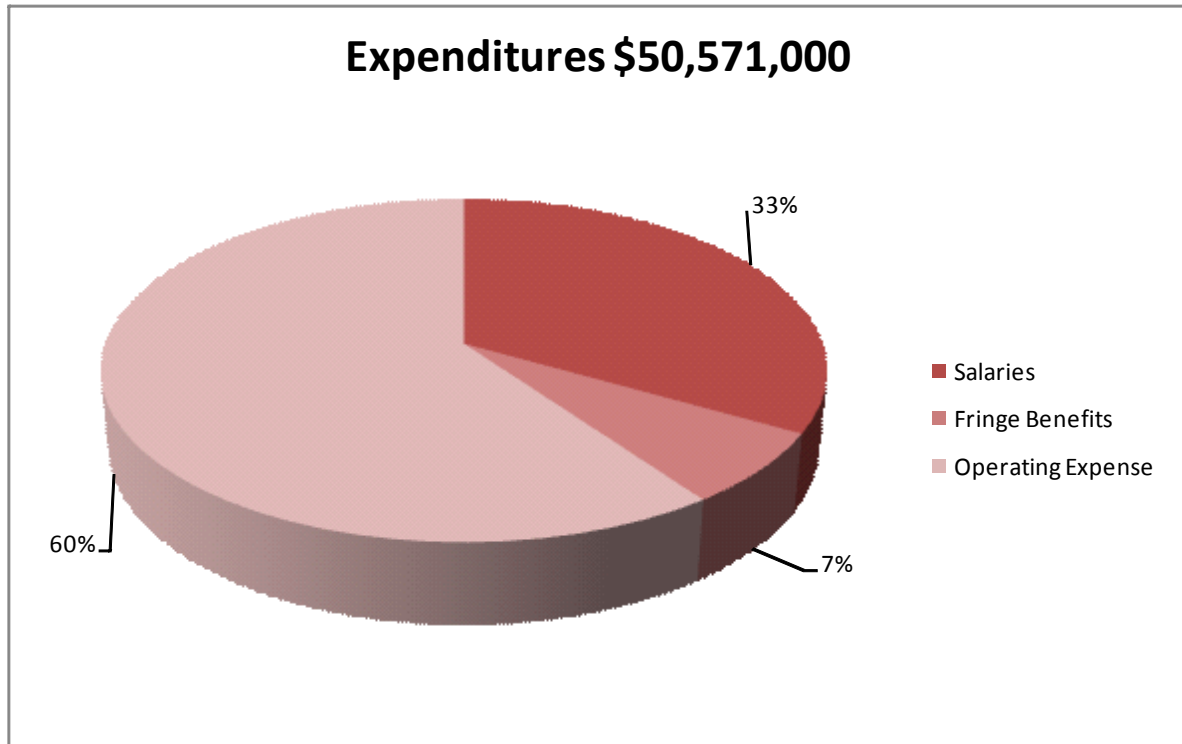
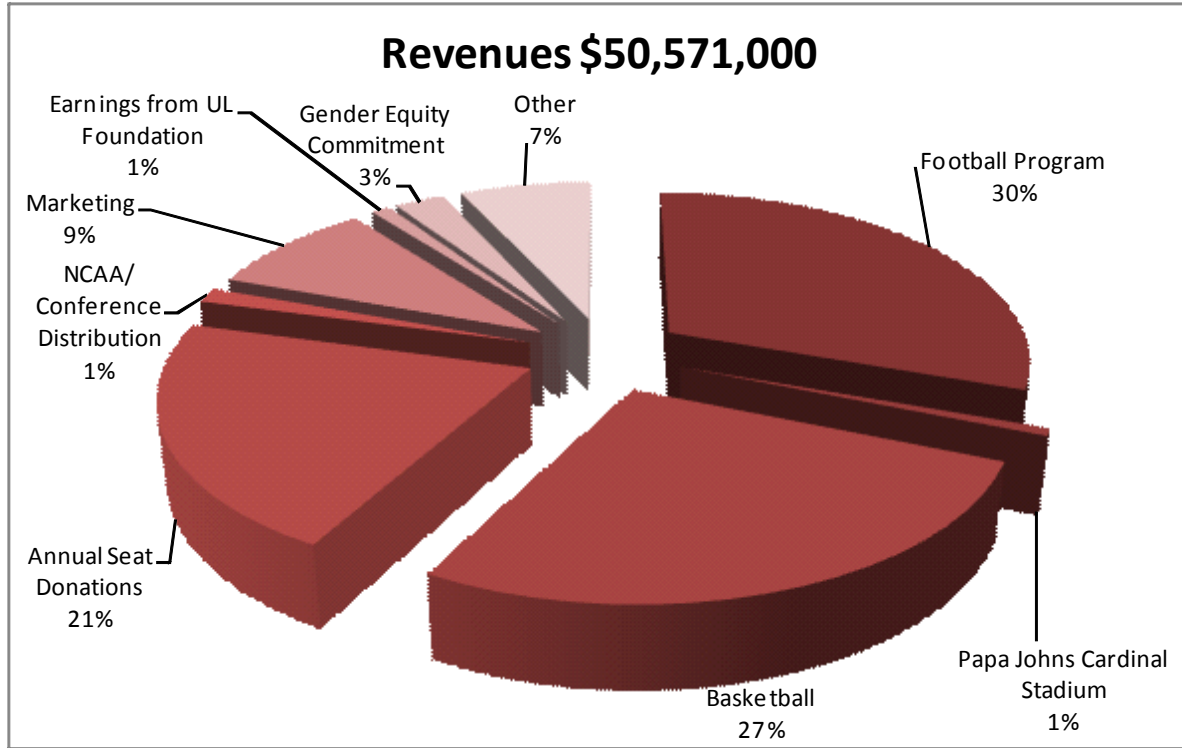

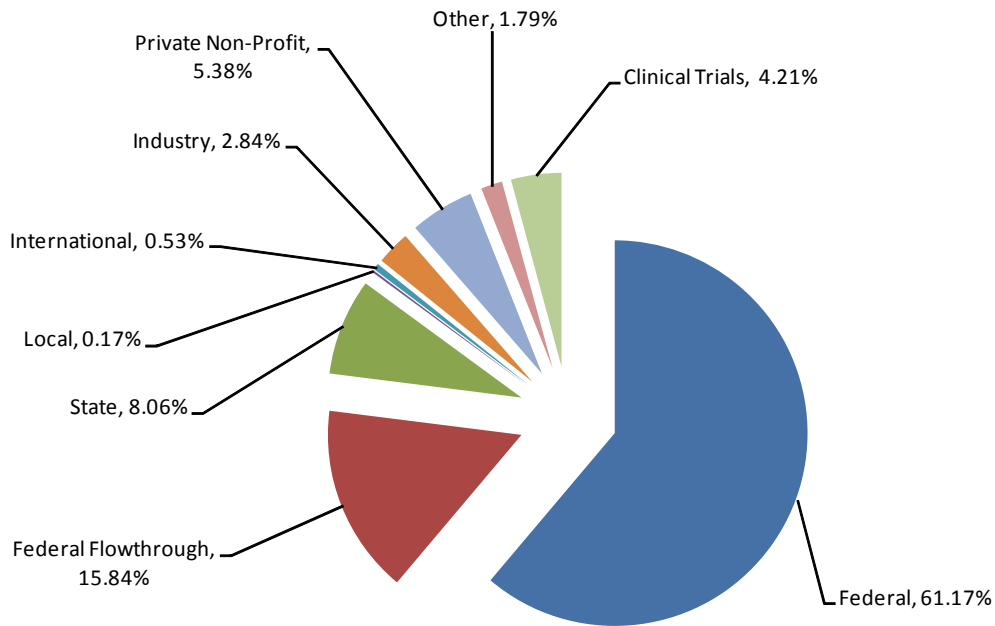

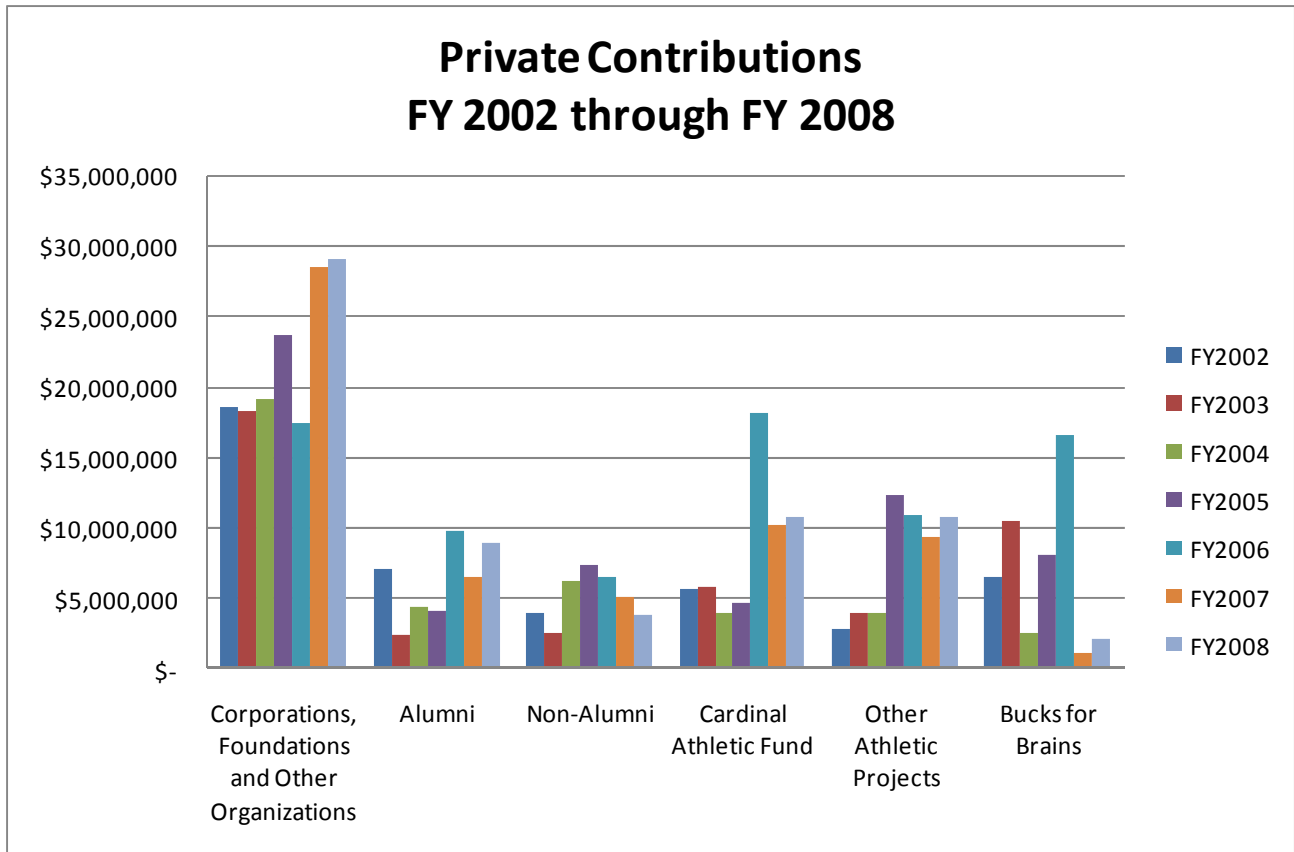
