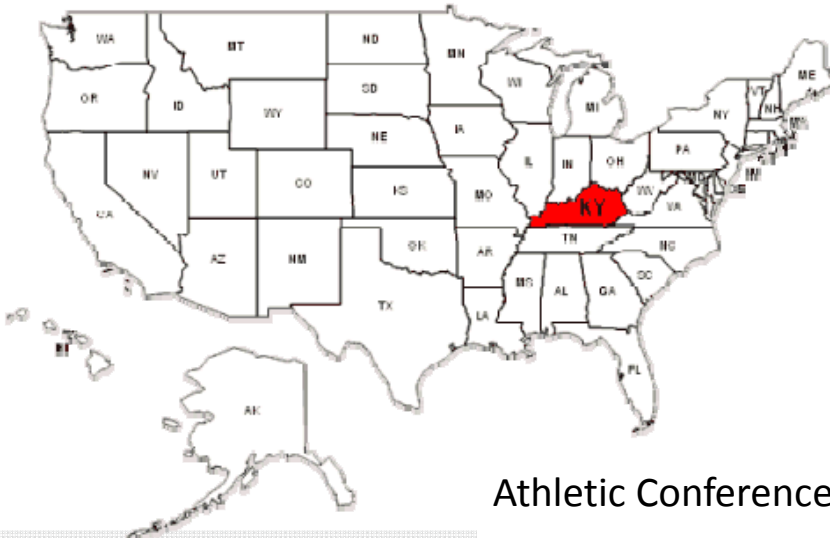

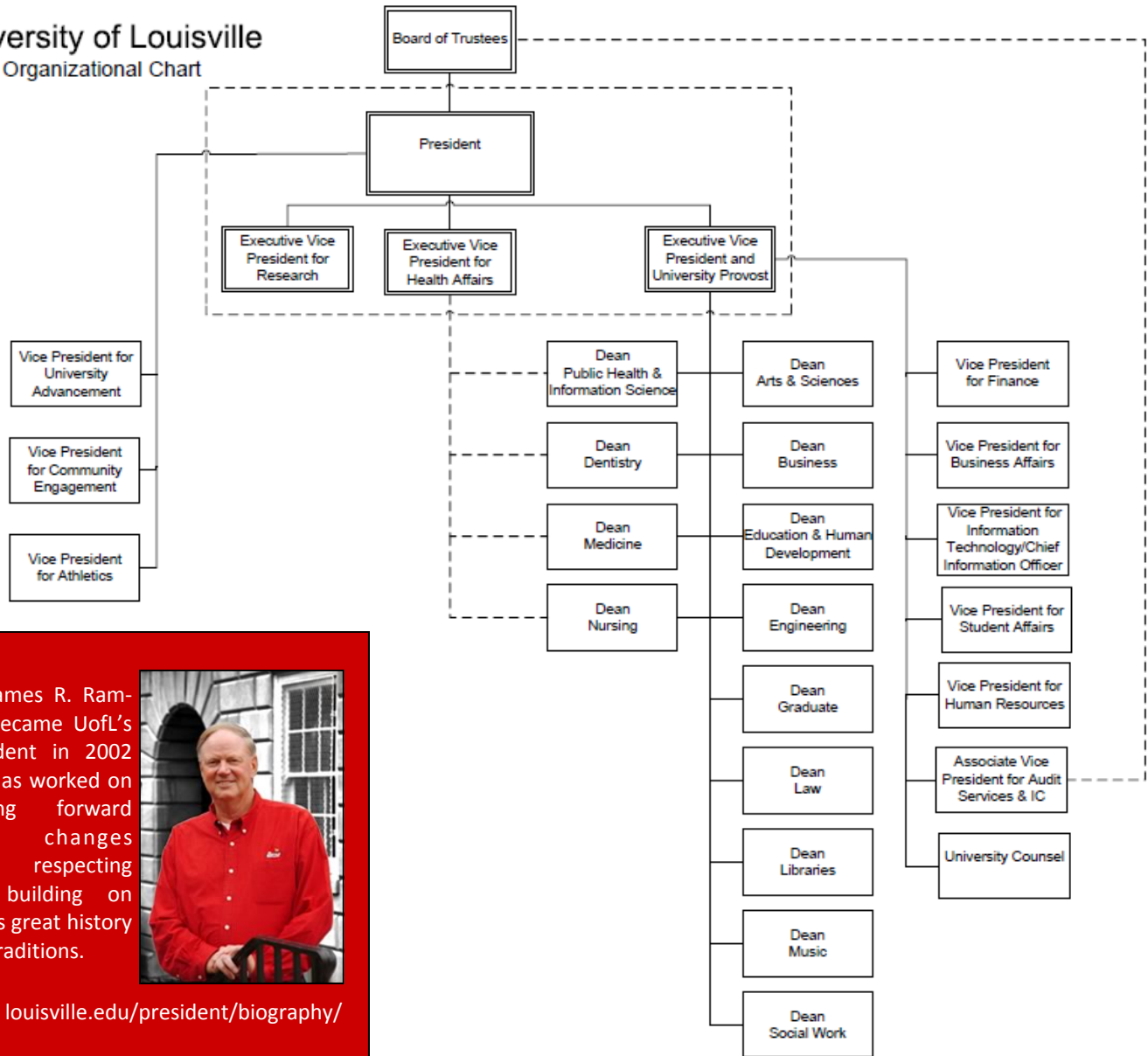

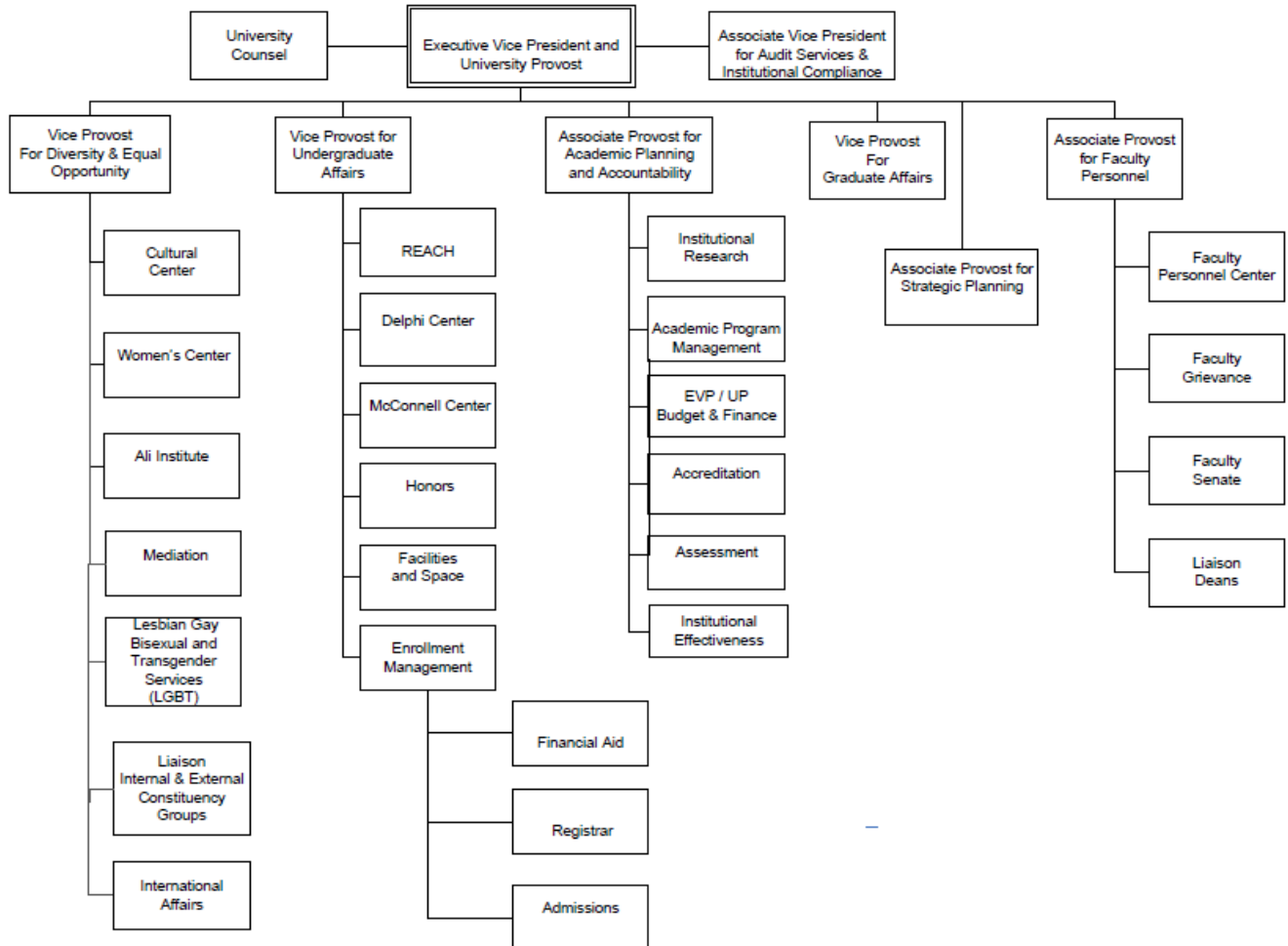
## University of Louisville Organizational Chart

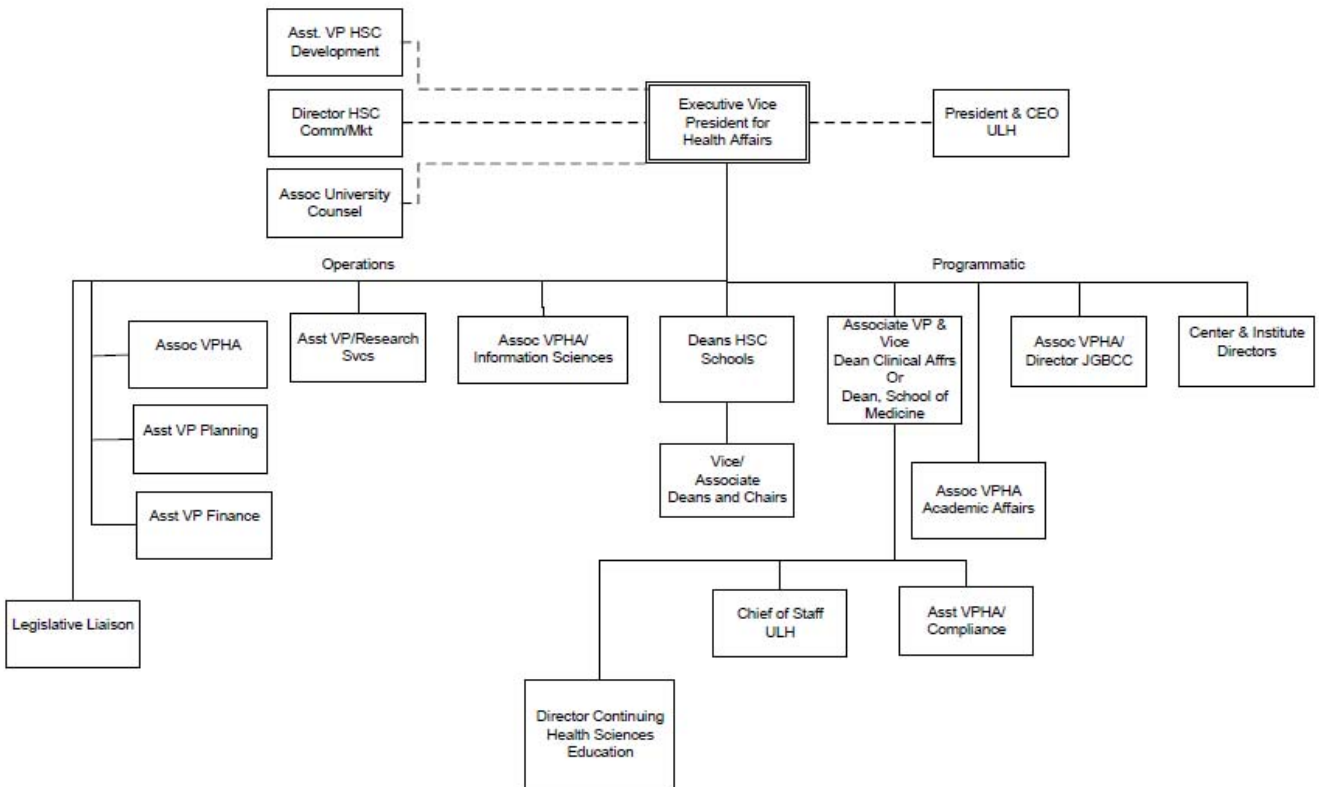
Dr. Shirley Willihnganz, executive vice president and university provost of the University of Louisville, is the chief academic and operating officer. The post touches all segments of the university.

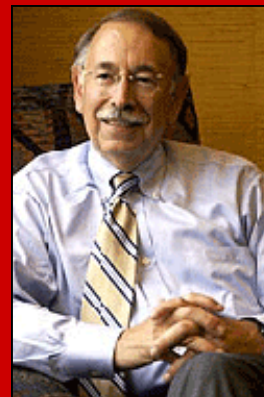

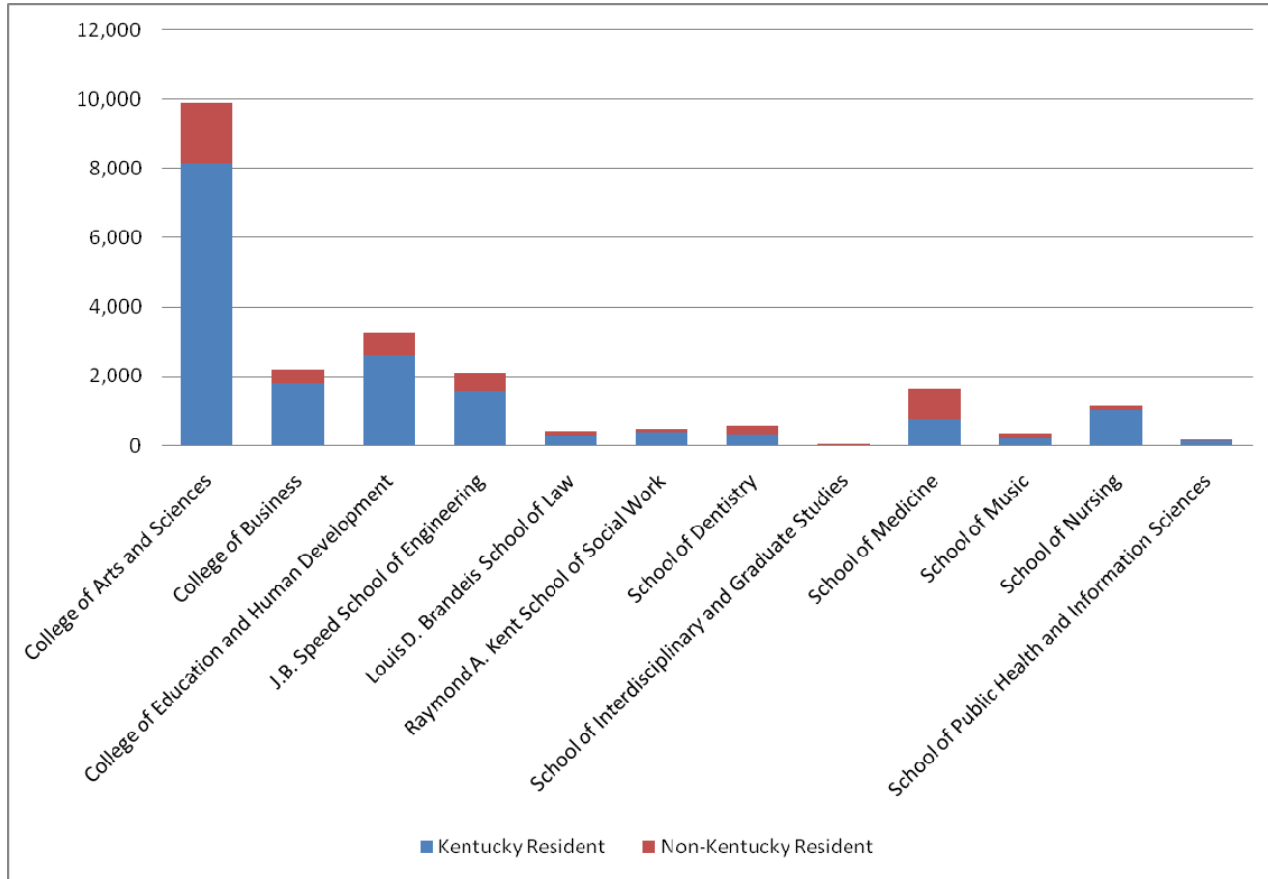

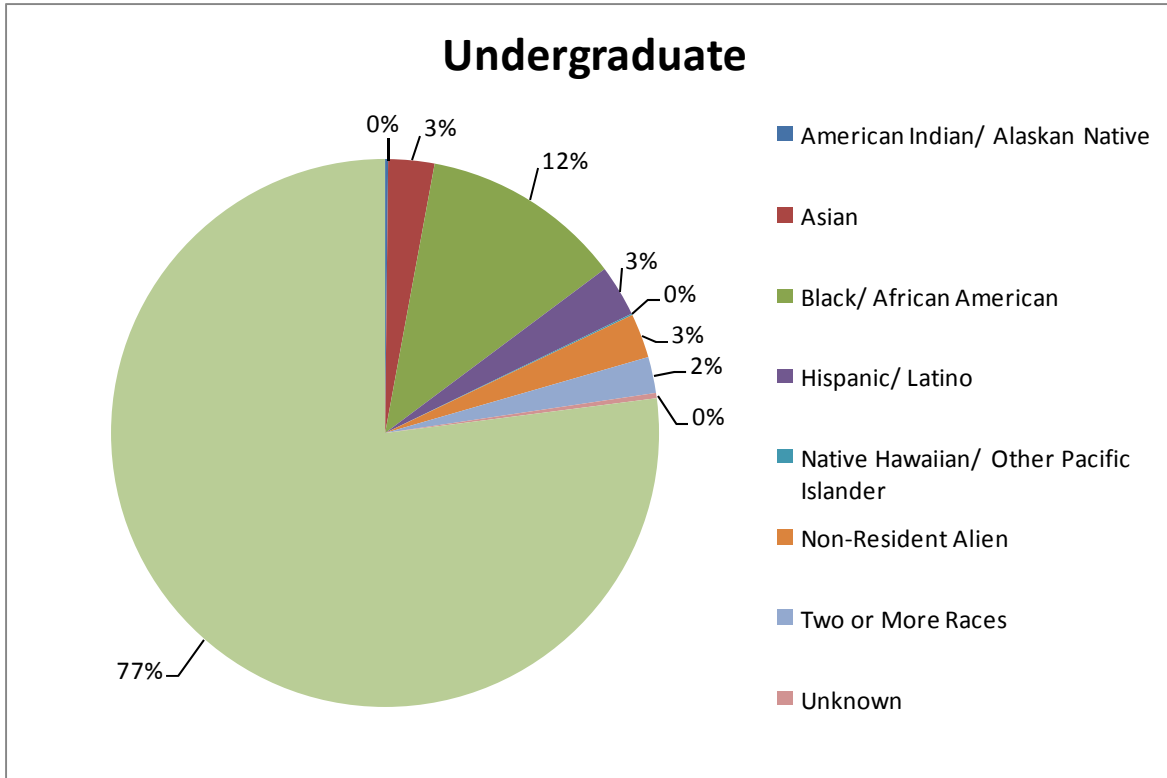

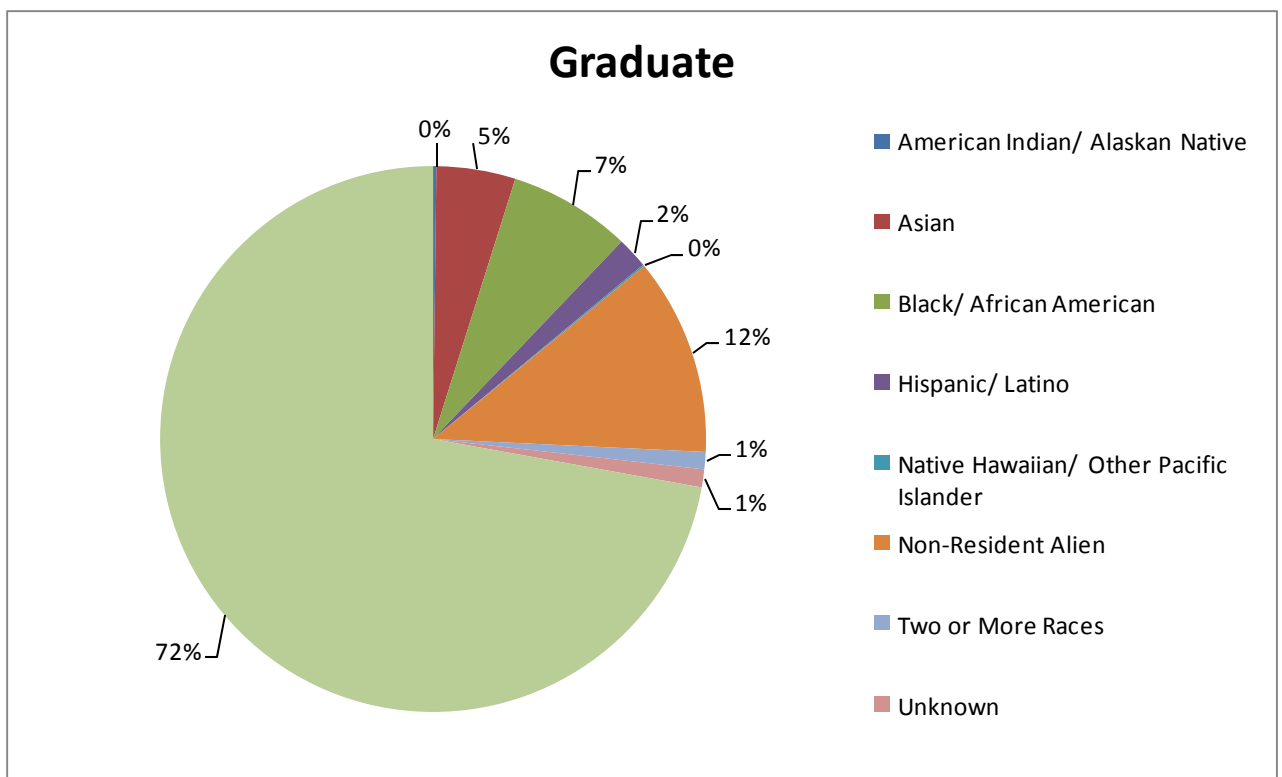

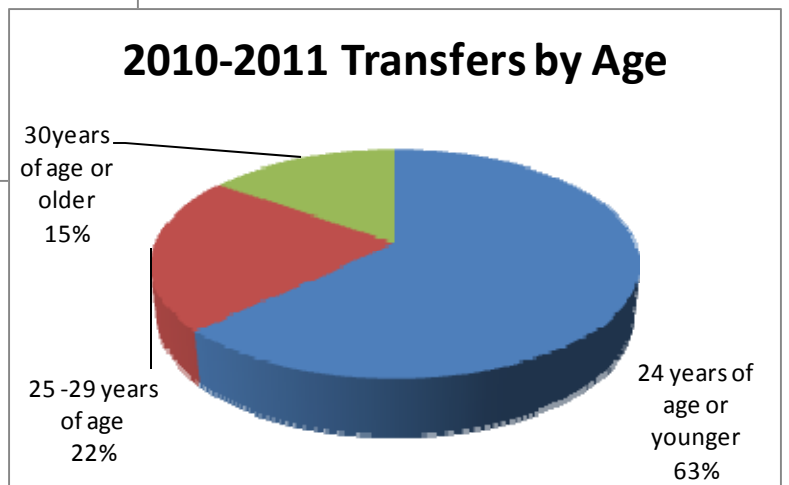
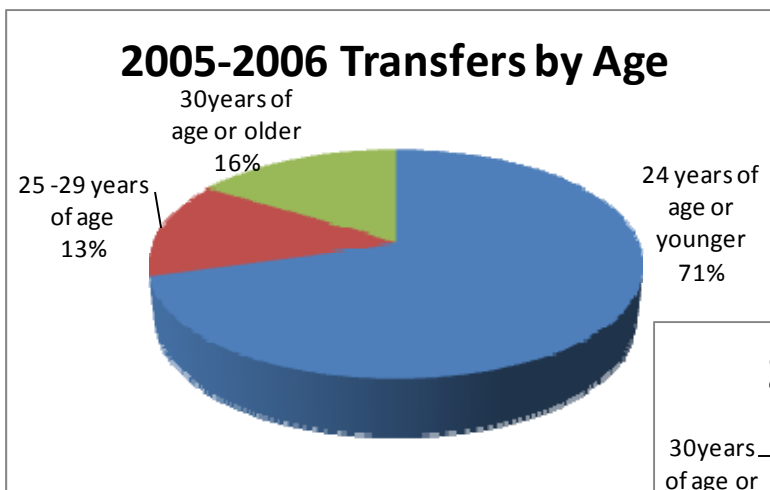
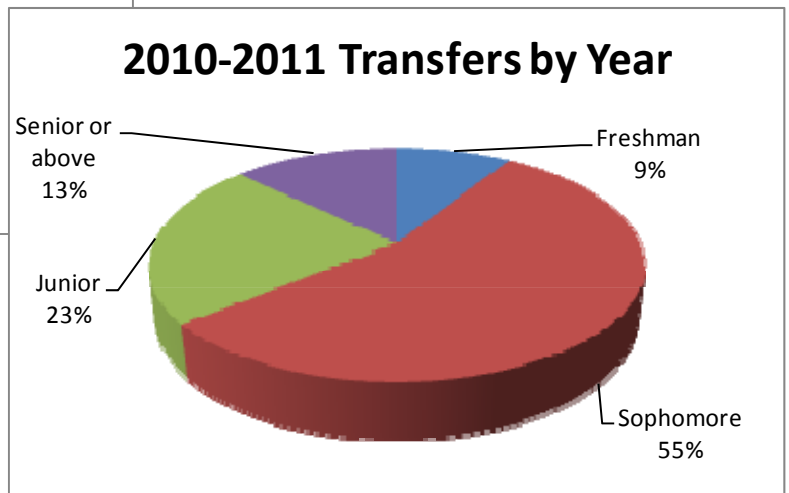
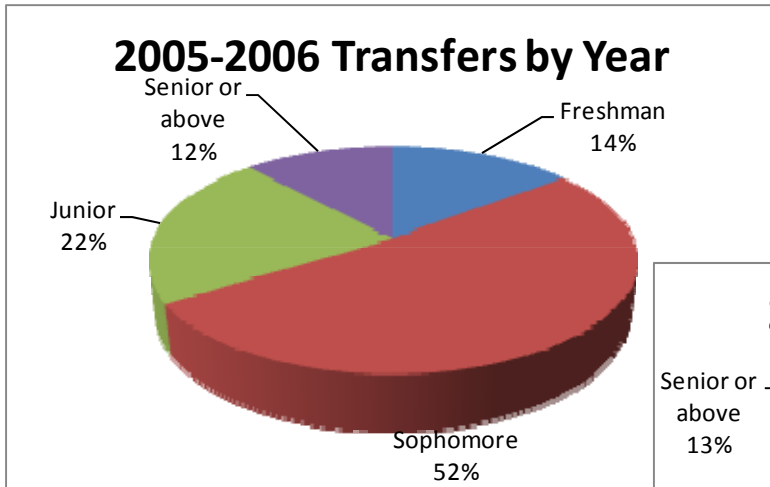
**ENROLLMENT BY STUDENT LEVEL AND RACE**



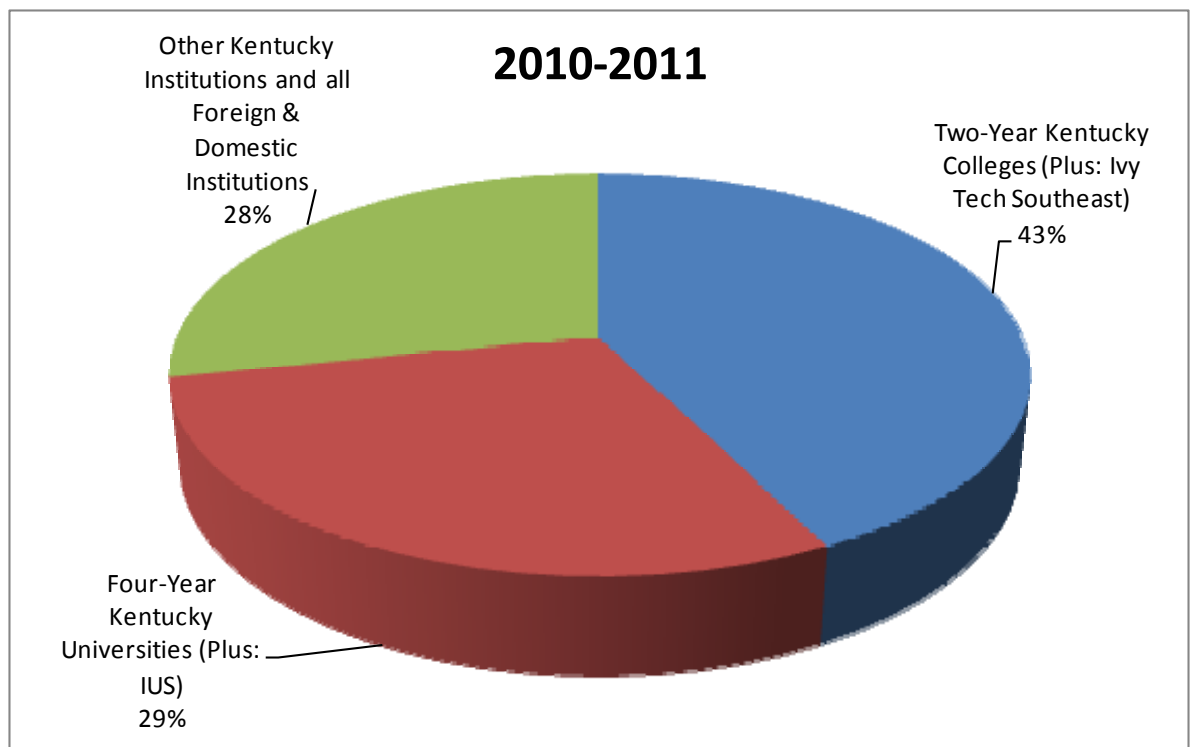
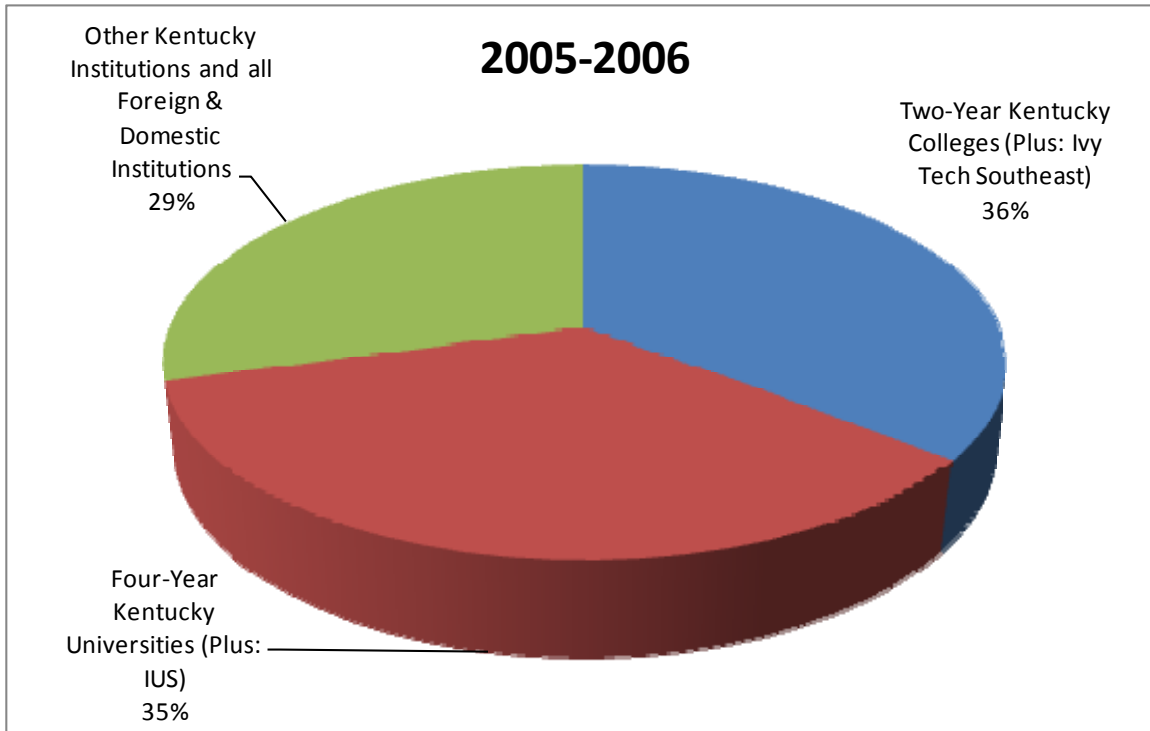

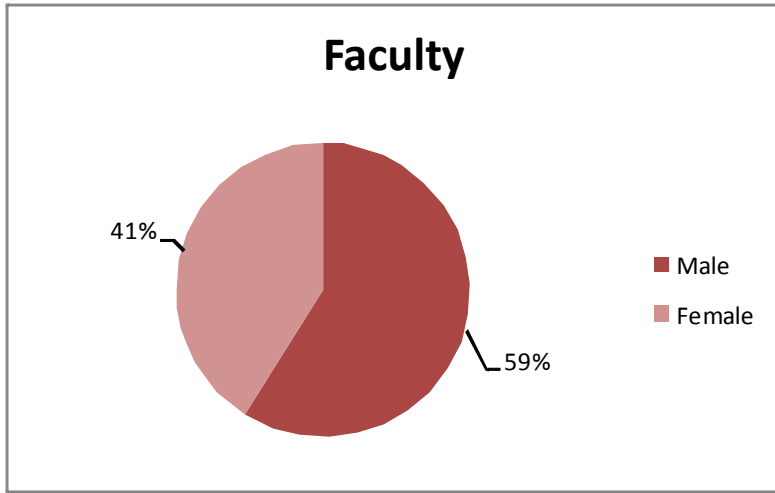

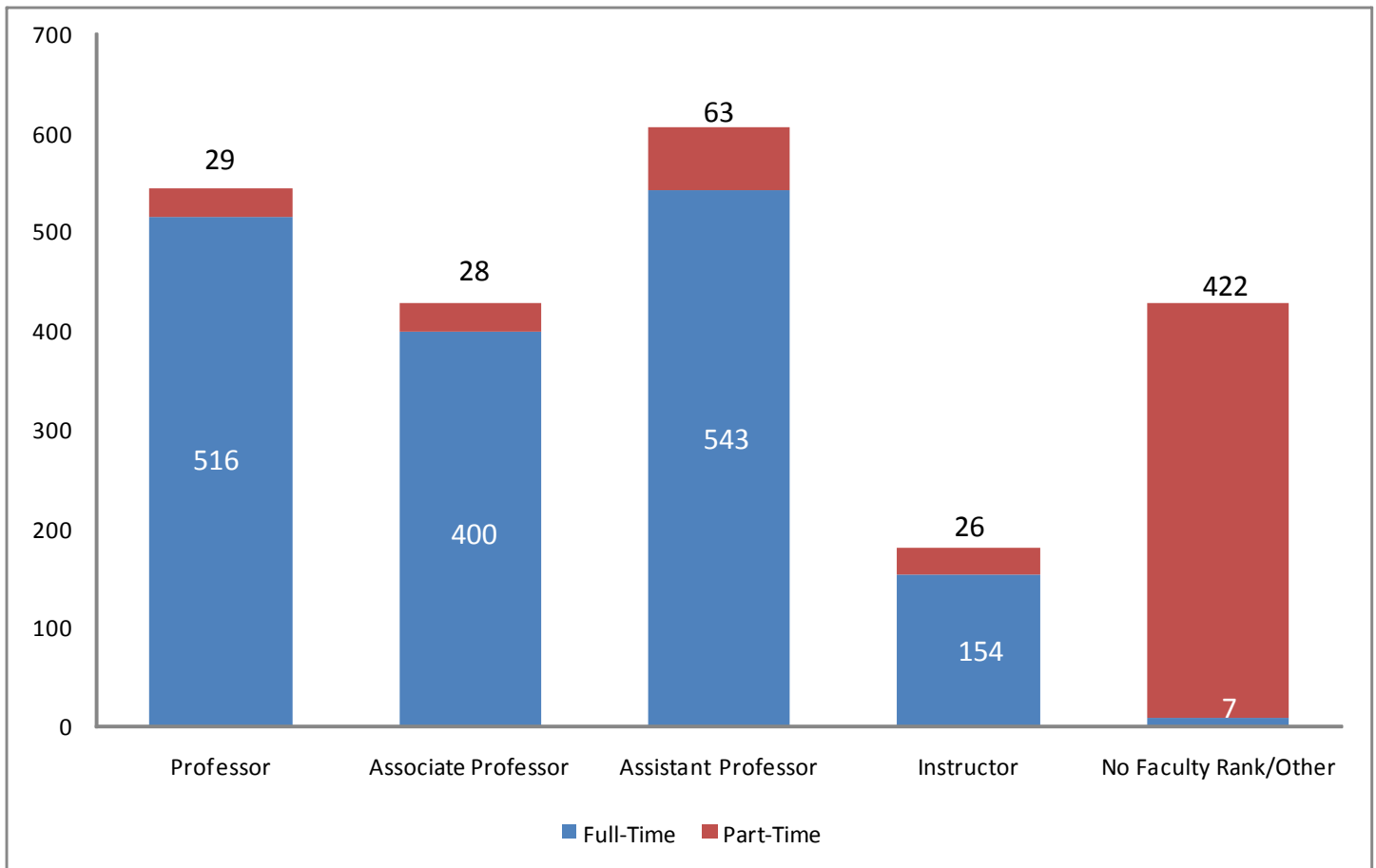

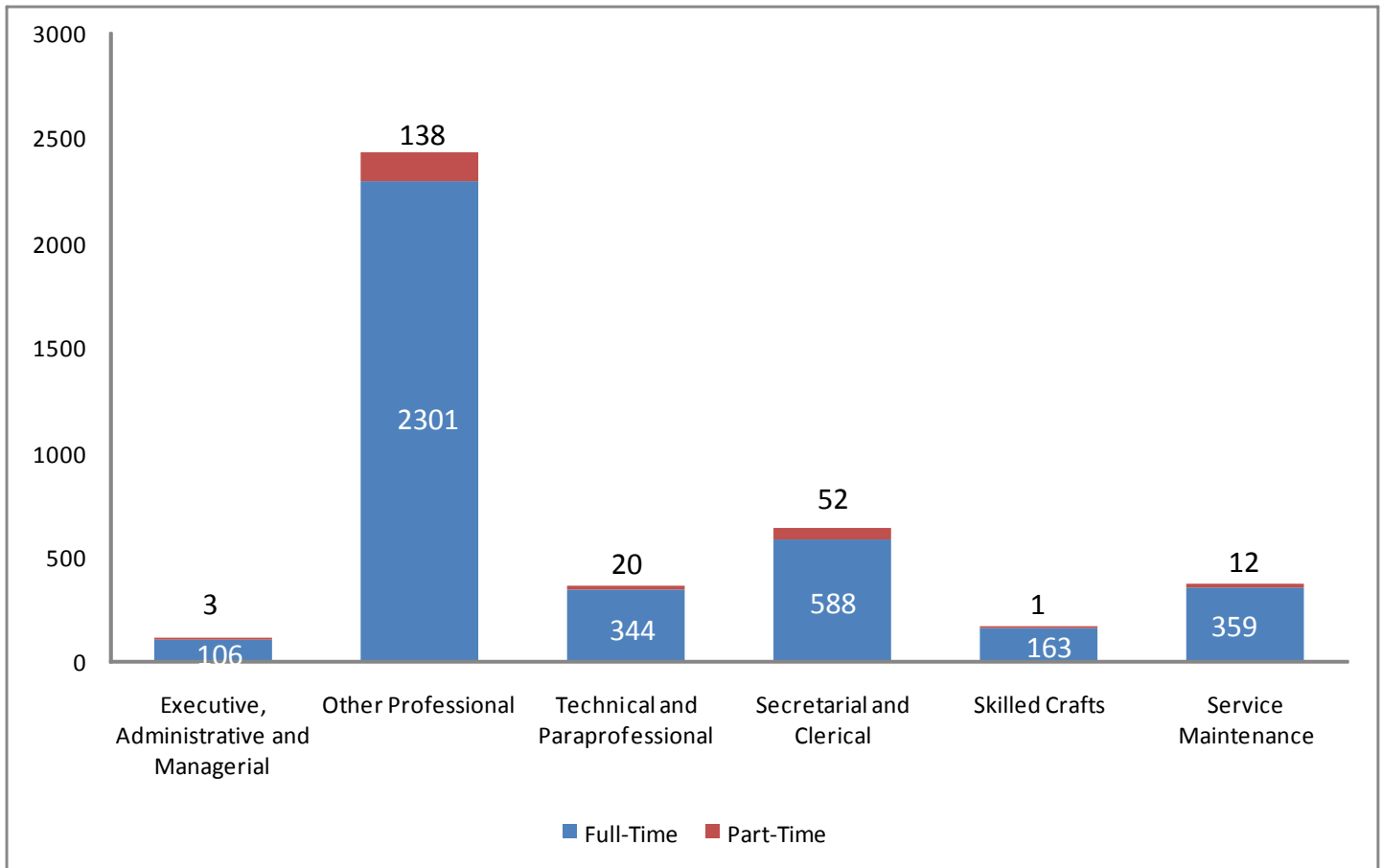

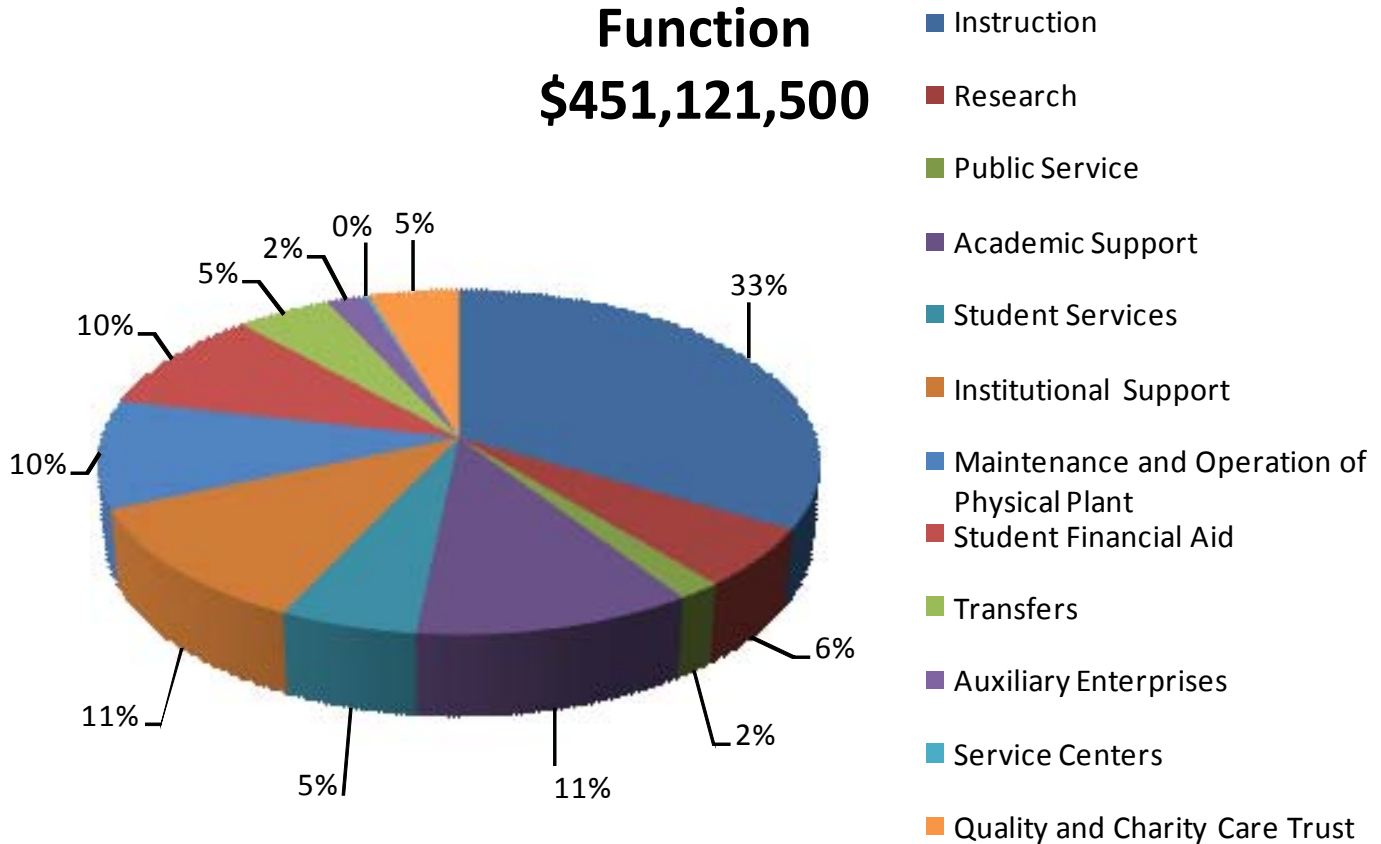
## Projected General Fund Revenue by Source \$451,121,500

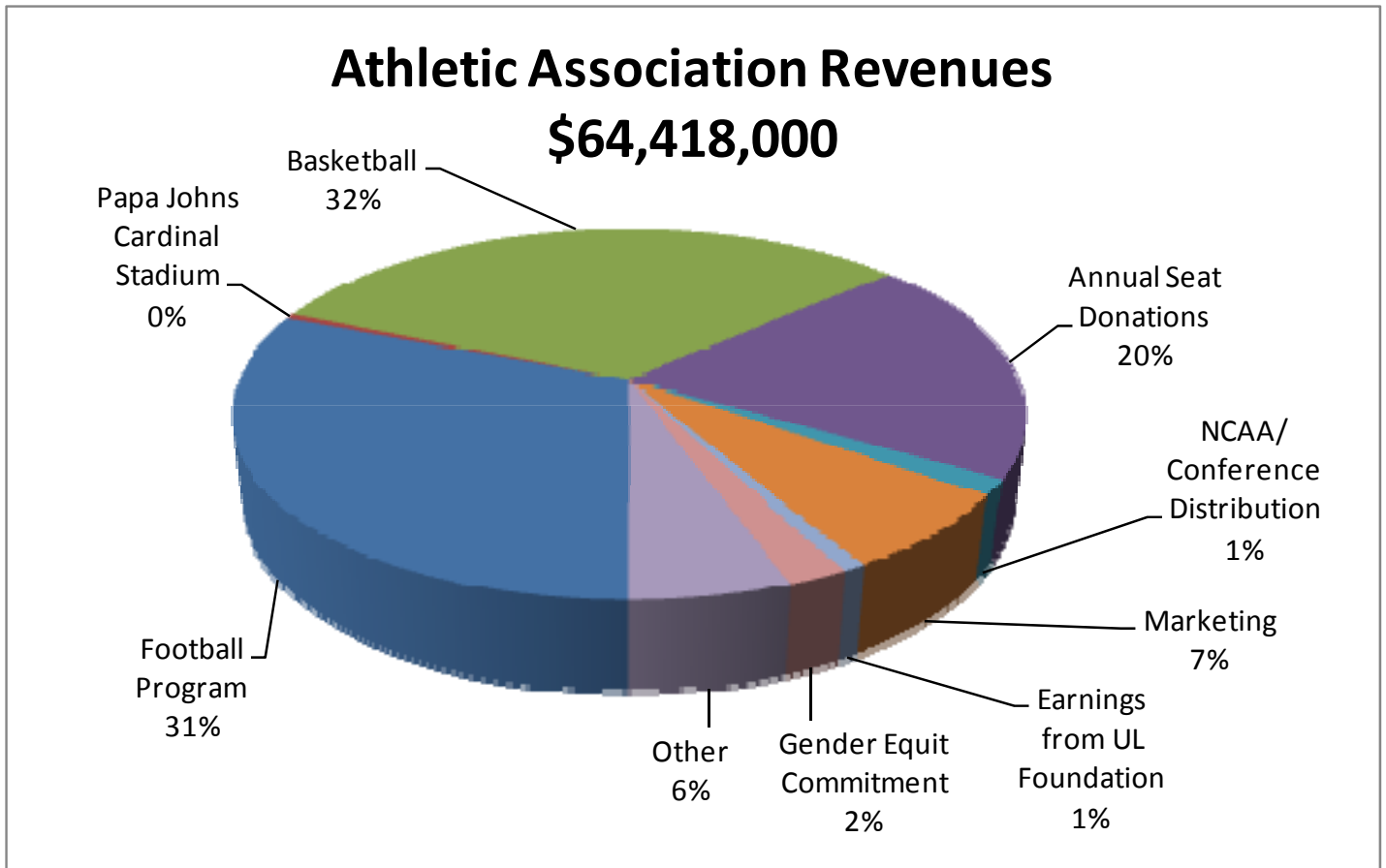

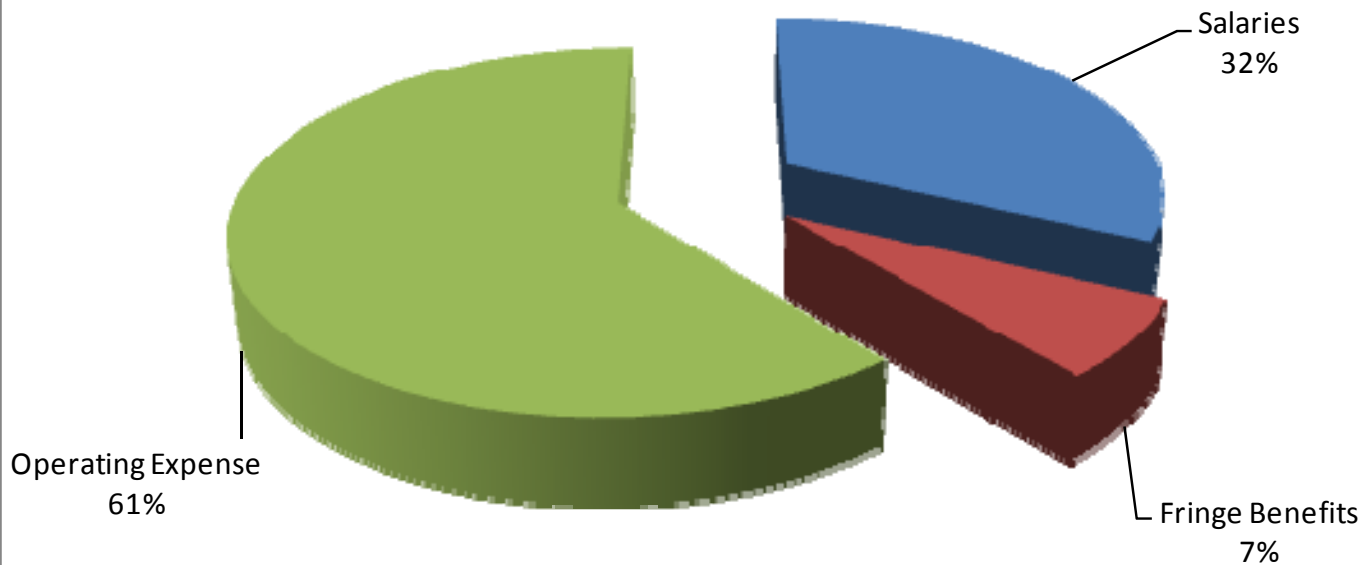

## Projected General Fund Expenditures by Function \$451,121,500





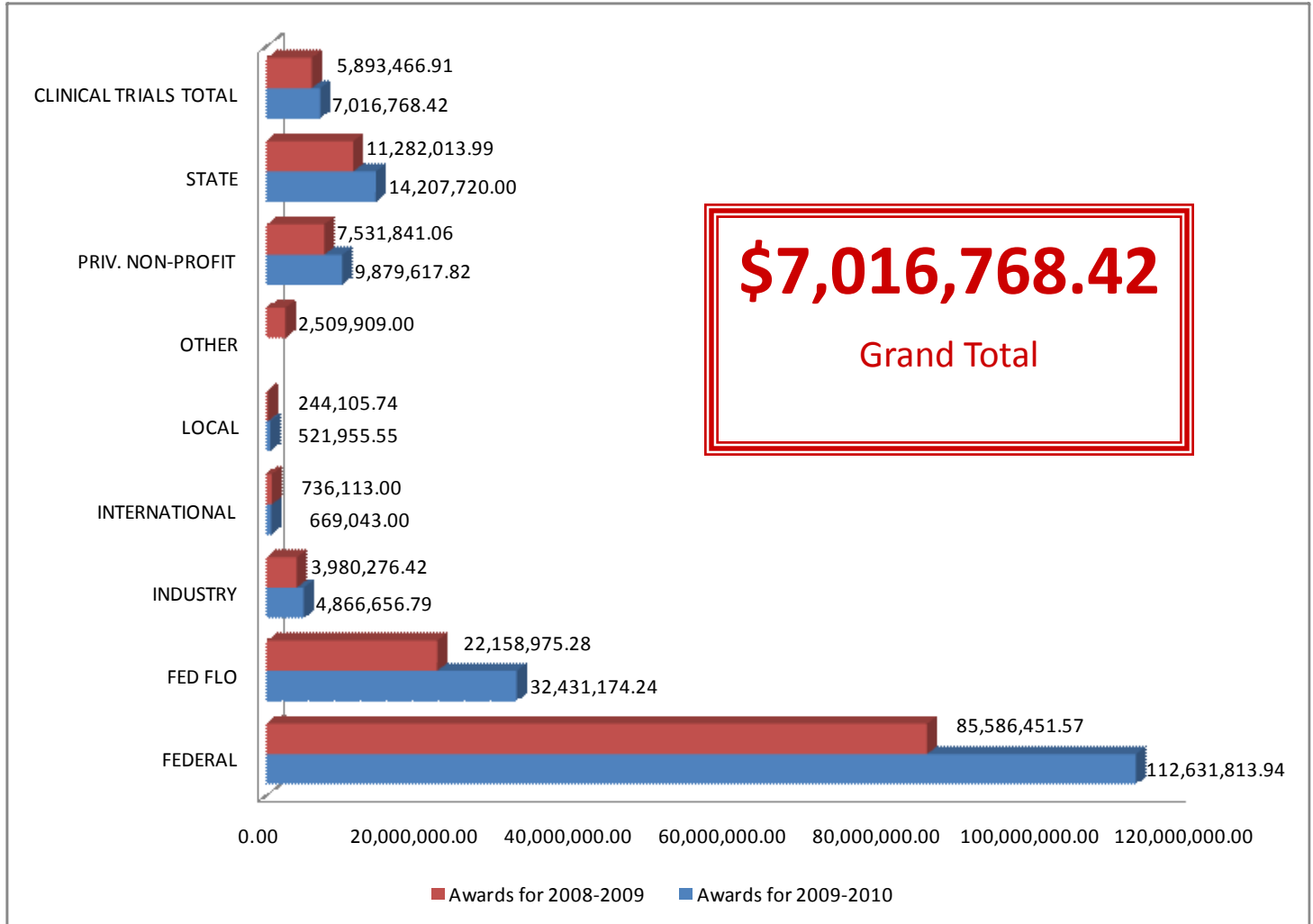
## Athletic Association Expenditures \$64,418,000
