The undergraduate student investigator must have completed his/her sophomore year or completed at least 60 course credit hours at the University of Louisville at the time the application is submitted. The student must be a member of a federally recognized underserved minority (African American, Hispanic, Native American, Alaskan Native or Pacific Islander).

The request for this funding initiative will be focused on support of UofL graduate student research that targets populations which are the focus of the commission – diverse, underserved, under-represented and/or vulnerable populations.
