*SUMMARY OF LEADERSHIP, COMMITTEE WORK AND ACCOMPLISHMENTS IN HIGHER EDUCATION

Research and Scholarship

- I was one of the major architects in collaboration with Riaan van Zyl in building the research infrastructure, securing federal funding and mentoring other faculty (24 tenured or tenure track) at the Kent School which led to a shift from \$1M in annual extramural funding of any type in 2000 to a current portfolio of \$9M in annual extramural funding and \$31M overall, most of which is federal, in 2022.
- On average I manage annual budgets averaging between \$1M- 2M a year; three to seven faculty, and four to seven staff and up to 40 part time workers.
- Created a Center for Child Welfare Training and Evaluation from a Senate Appropriation which led to the idea for the Children's Bureau National Child Welfare Workforce Institute (NCWWI).
- In October 2016, the Children's Bureau awarded a \$15,000,000 contract to the University of Nebraska in collaboration with the University of Louisville (I am Lead Evaluator), the University of Colorado-Denver, UCLA, and the University of Tennessee for the Quality Improvement Center on Workforce Development (QIC-WD) for us to conduct research on workforce interventions to determine what works. This brings my total grant portfolio run through UL to \$58.4 million. I also have helped other organizations secure an additional \$33 million in extramural funding with the Children's Bureau and the CDC for various evaluation projects. So overall, \$91 million portfolio.
- Helped lead the faculty in creating a diverse portfolio of funding streams including NIH (NIA, NIDA, NIAAA, NICHD, NIMH), but also including CDC, DOJ (OJJDP, NIJ, VAW), HRSA, HUD, SAMHSA, USAID, Department of Education and many Bureaus in ACYF including the Children's Bureau, the Child Care Bureau, the Family and Youth Services Bureau, the Office of Refugee Resettlement, the Office of Community Service, the Office of Adolescent Health, Office of Population Affairs, and Office of Financial Assistance.
- I have been a grant reviewer for the Children's Bureau, National Science Foundation (NSF), Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC), Social Sciences and Humanities Research Council of Canada, Research Grant Council of Hong Kong, and the Society for the Psychological Study of Social Issues (SPSSI), Issues RFA Program
- Led the faculty in increasing our publication rate from an average of 20 a year to an average of 75 a year.
- I personally have 188 publications (out or in press) and over 511 presentations at professional conferences and meetings mostly at the International or national level, but also at the state and local levels. My work is highly cited (7269). My h-index is 40 (i10-index is 68).
- Beyond my own scholarship, I also have been an Associate Editor for the journals, Personal Relationships and Training and Development in Human Services, and have been on the Editorial Boards of 13 journals including Journal of Society of Social Work Research, Annual Editions: Human Sexuality, Annual Editions: Social Psychology, Social Services Review, Journal of Public Child Welfare, Journal of Loss and Trauma, Motivation and Emotion, Journal of Social and Personal Relationships, Families in Society, Journal of Social Behavior and Personality, Personal Relationships, Training and Development in Human Services and PLOS.

- Member of all Kent School Committees over the years including Academic Review Committee, Advisor, Admissions, Budget, Curriculum, Development, Faculty Affairs, Outcomes, On-Line Oversight, Personnel, Recruitment, Research, Search, Strategic Planning (Chair of Committee on Committees in order to streamline the number of meetings faculty have to attend), Y2K Task Force.

Academic Programs and Supports

- I am the Interim PhD Program Director which follows a long history with the program. I was part of the original faculty of the Doctoral Program at the Kent School which began in 1997. I taught a grant writing course for a number of years and continue to serve on that faculty mostly to orient students to the research of the faculty and to serve as Chair and Committee member on Doctoral Committees. I have also supported doctoral students on grant projects.
- On the team that developed the Public Child Welfare Certification Program (PCWCP) in 1996 which is still in operation. The model utilizes Title IV-E funds to support tuition remission and stipends for BSW students in the 11 accredited BSW programs in Kentucky (University of Louisville, University of Kentucky, Eastern Kentucky University, Kentucky State University, Morehead State University, Murray State University, Northern Kentucky University, Western Kentucky University, Brescia College, Campbellsville University and Spalding University). Students are carefully selected to enter the PCWCP program. During their Junior and Senior years in college, they take several child welfare related courses which are developed collaboratively and delivered using the same syllabus across all 11 Universities and do their field placements in public child welfare offices. They also attend annual retreats and learn about the agency. They commit to work for the public child welfare agency for two years (as payback for the Cabinet investment in their college education). My role in the creation of the program and ongoing is as the evaluator. I have worked with numerous state systems across the country to replicate this model and our method of evaluation of it (e.g., Georgia, Indiana, Nebraska, Vermont, Wisconsin).
- Spearheaded the development of the Credit for Learning (CFL) program with the Cabinet for Children and Families, Protection and Permanency Branch (Child Welfare) in 2002 which ran through 2022. This was a unique partnership nationally in that new worker and veteran worker/supervisor training is developed jointly by University faculty teaching in Schools of Social Work with an accredited Masters of Social Work program (University of Louisville, University of Kentucky, Western Kentucky University) with input from curriculum developers in the Training Branch. All new workers who take these CFL courses receive MSW credit from any of the three institutions (as electives). This has enhanced the number of Cabinet staff receiving an MSW. Once I brought the program to U of L, I handed it over to Dr. Bibhuti Sar so that he could develop the courses and run the program (which brings in additional tuition dollars to the Kent School of up to \$800,000 annually). As part of my Child Welfare Training Assessment Contract with the state, I evaluate the program along with related programs.
- Part of inaugural DSW Program at Kent School which began in 2021. Developed and taught once the Implementation Science course.
- Was Chair of the Curriculum Committee (2014-2016) and helped review the CSWE Accreditation Self Study document.

Research Areas

Personal Relationship Processes and Interventions: Social Support Process in Close Relationships

My first contribution to science began with my dissertation and focuses on the social support process in close relationships. While there were numerous studies on the positive impact of perceived social support on health, less was known about the complex context of the seeking, giving and receipt of social support in personal relationships nor about the wide array of specific behaviors offered by close relations to address someone's distress. So, I developed a theory outlining the variables that are likely to affect this intricate interplay, a typology of interactive coping or social support seeking and giving behaviors and worked with colleagues to apply the theory and typology for different types of relationships and distressing situations including facing a devastating disease like HIV. I was also the first to experimentally manipulate seeker and helper variables that could impact the process and to attempt to tease out which social support behaviors are most likely to benefit help seekers. We found that the theory and typology are useful for conceptualizing and testing the process and under what circumstances social support provision is more or less helpful. So far, we have published 24 journal articles and handbook chapters from this work in such high impact journals as AIDS and Behavior, Journal of Experimental Social Psychology, Journal of Social Issues, Communication Yearbook, Journal of Applied Social Psychology, Personal Relationships, Journal of Health Psychology, Journal of Social and Personal Relationships, Journal of Nonverbal Behavior, Journal of Social Behavior and Personality and co-edited a book on the topic, HIV and Social Interaction. Other researchers have used the theory and measurement of behaviors. The work advanced the field of personal relationships, social support, and interpersonal processes in coping with HIV. I received a dissertation award in 1989 and an early career award in 1997 from the International Association of Relationship Researchers (IARR) for my work in this area.

Attraction and Relationship Initiation, Maintenance and Change

Another contribution to science is in collaboration with Dr. Michael Cunningham on understanding the attraction process in romantic relationships including the delineation of what constitutes facial physical attractiveness. This work advanced the field by applying an evolutionary theoretical framework to the field of attraction and facial attractiveness and by careful measurement of features affecting perceptions of beauty across numerous cultures. We found that neonatal features, maturity features, expressive features and grooming features all contribute to perceptions of facial attractiveness in multiple genders. Perceived attractiveness of certain facial features seem to have a biological basis, but other features of attractiveness such as weight, scarification and choice of jewelry and clothing are culturally derived. Out of this work we developed the Multi-Fitness Model of Attraction. This work was extended through collaborations with plastic surgeons on facial transplants and through an NICHD funded grant to conduct experimental studies aimed at understanding the influence of peers on mate selection in several species (e.g., guppies and humans). In addition, we have conducted several studies on personal relationship formation, maintenance and change beyond those specifically focused on social support and attraction as noted above. Beyond the 15 journal articles in high impact journals such as Journal of Personality and Social Psychology, Journal of Sex Research, Journal of Research in Personality, and Journal of Loss and Trauma as well as chapters in influential books, this work also includes 15 book reviews and commentaries in top journals (e.g., Contemporary Psychology) and organizational publications. These publications simply add to the growing field of interpersonal relationships. Because of all of this work, I was asked to serve and did serve as the Associate Editor of a journal in the field, Personal Relationships from 2008 to 2012, and I was President-Elect of IARR from 2016-2018, President from 2018-2020 and Past President from 2020-2022. I was also inducted into the Society of Experimental Social Psychologists (SESP) in 2017 because of my work in these areas and relationship education.

Healthy Relationship Enhancement Intimate Partner Violence Prevention and Intervention Teen Pregnancy Prevention

Another contribution to science is testing the effectiveness of healthy relationship curricula aimed at lowincome adults and adolescents on improving relationship satisfaction, enhancing father involvement with children, reducing intimate partner conflict and violence (domestic violence, dating violence, child maltreatment) and reducing high risk sexual behaviors. Previous work in the field had focused on efficacy of healthy marriage curricula on middle class married couples. Our research tested the efficacy of PREP- an evidence based healthy marriage curriculum developed and tested by Stanley and Markman- with adoptive parents to reduce adoption disruption - as well as derivatives of PREP- with low-income single adults and youth. I have conducted this research in collaboration with my former doctoral student and colleague, Dr. Becky Antle via several federal grants funded by the Children's Bureau, the Office of Family Support, the Office of Adolescent Health, Family and Youth Services Bureau, and local foundation grants. We have found that the PREP-based Within My Reach and Love Notes curricula as well as another curriculum I developed- KRUSH- all led to the positive outcomes of improving relationship communication, reducing intimate partner violence, and reducing high risk sexual behavior among individuals experiencing poverty as well as violence and other relationship problems. To conduct this work, we have overseen the delivery of these and related curricula (Reducing the Risk) in low-income Louisville neighborhoods and are or have enlisted over 2500 adults and 4000 adolescents in receiving the curricula and participating in quasi-experiments and randomized controlled efficacy trials and followed participants for up to two years to collect follow up data. We tested the effectiveness of 24/7 Dad to reduce parent partner conflict and enhance father involvement among 900 fathers as well.

In addition, our team spent a few years evaluating the efficacy of various policies and programs aimed at reducing and intervening in domestic violence situations. I was Principal Investigator on the grants funded through VAWA dollars and the state Cabinet for Families and Children and conducted it in collaboration with colleagues and doctoral students. Only a handful of states, one of which was Kentucky, had laws aimed at ensuring that medical and mental health providers became mandatory reporters of domestic violence. We were the first to evaluate the impact of that law in Kentucky on outcomes for victims of domestic violence. We found that victims liked the mandatory reporting law and appreciated the interventions which helped them leave their abusive spouses and partners. We also evaluated a special program which allowed social workers to work with police in domestic violence runs. We found that the presence of the social worker helped in de-escalation of the situations and improved service delivery to victims of domestic violence and their children. These findings contributed to the ongoing dialogue about how best to intervene in domestic violence situations. So far, across all of the work described here, we have published 22 journal articles in top social work and family studies journals including American Journal of Public Health, Family Relations, Personal Relationships, Children and Youth Services Review, Journal of Marital and Family Therapy, Family Process, Couple and Family Psychology: Research and Practice, Families in Society, Journal of Family Social Work, Violence Against Women, Journal of Aggression, Maltreatment and Trauma, and American Journal of Sexuality Education. I am also a Fellow in the APA, Society for the Psychological Study of Social Issues (SPSSI).

Organizational and Community Improvement: Comprehensive Training Evaluation Model and Workforce Development

My second major area focuses on testing a training evaluation model Antle, van Zyl and I developed to improve training directed towards the child welfare workforce in the initial Academy training as well as special topics including child welfare and substance abuse, supervision, preparing foster youth for independent living, reducing racial disparities through the *Undoing Racism* curriculum, Solution Based Casework, and couple team relationships to reduce child maltreatment. We also applied the model in evaluating the Children's Bureau Training and Technical Assistance Network which later became the Capacity Building Collaborative. Previous evaluation efforts lacked a theoretical driving force and did not include measurement of the individual, team and organizational variables or factors that affect the delivery of training and their impact on the uptake of the material in terms of knowledge gain, attitude change, training transfer and organizational (e.g., staff retention) and client outcomes (safety, permanency, and well-being). We have moved the entire field of child welfare training evaluation to a sophisticated level, contributed to the growing field of implementation science and influenced the Children's Bureau expectations for grantees with regards to evaluation. I have been Principal Investigator on most of the grants that funded this research through state contracts and the Children's Bureau, and the Child Care Bureau and built a team of other faculty (besides Antle & van Zyl) and doctoral students who conduct the work with me. I also won the Lifetime Achievement Award in 2007 and the Career Service Award in 2014 from the National Staff Development and Training Association (NSDTA), a unit of the larger American Public Human Services Association (APHSA) for this work and applied it in 30 states. I just completed a round as Advisory Board member for NSDTA. Finally, I hosted the 20th Anniversary of the National Human Services Training and Evaluation Symposium in Louisville in the spring of 2017 which brought together the best scholars in this area in the nation. We now apply our training evaluation model to family support services training, healthy relationship education, fatherhood education, and teen pregnancy prevention training interventions.

Training is but one aspect of the larger area of workforce development in child welfare. In our work in Kentucky and 29 other states around the country, we have 1) helped jurisdictions enhance their recruitment and selection processes for front line staff through development of such programs as PCWCP, 2) worked on how to best prepare staff for supervisory positions through programs like MSW Stipend programs, 3) ensured the competence of the workforce through installation of an evidence based practice model (see below), training, rigorous testing, and carefully crafted coaching programs like the Field Training Specialist-FTS- program, 4) ensured the quality of supervision through testing of supervisory competence, training and coaching, 5) assessed and improved organizational culture and climate, 6) installed interventions to alleviate staff stress and secondary trauma (see more below), and 7) tracked retention/turnover while also using CQI processes such as conducting exit interviews and feeding the information back to the agency, extracting trends (such as generational differences in approaches to work). I have also trained countless child welfare and other child serving staff and supervisors through workshops, day long and multi-day trainings on such topics as Childhood Trauma, Dealing with Secondary Trauma, Leadership in Supervision, How to Be a Clinical Supervisor, Solution Based Casework, Working across Generations, Understanding Normal Sexual Development of Children to Prevent Sexual Abuse, and how to deliver Love Notes with fidelity. This work has led to a culminating grant. In collaboration with the University of Nebraska- Center for Children, Families and the Law, the University of Colorado-Denver Kempe Center, UCLA, the University of Tennessee and several small consulting firms, our team received a \$17M contract from the Children's Bureau- the Quality Improvement Center for Workforce Development (QIC-WD). This funding has allowed us to install and evaluate 8 workforce interventions to test the efficacy of single or multiple interventions on workforce outcomes between 2016 and 2023. When COVID-19 hit we incorporated measures in surveys to assess the impact of the coronavirus on practice and outcomes. We also have conducted trainings on coping with COVID-19, supervising virtually and coaching in the era of COVID.

Child Welfare Practice Model Installation and Evaluation

As part of the workforce development work, we have focused on developing mechanisms to install a child welfare casework practice model, Solution Based Casework, into large public child welfare agencies and tested the efficacy of the intervention on child and youth outcomes of safety, permanency, and well-being. This is the first comprehensive casework practice model ever developed for child welfare systems and the only one that has been rigorously evaluated. I have conducted this work in collaboration with my colleagues Dr. Becky Antle and Dr. Riaan van Zyl and the developer of the intervention, Dr. Dana Christensen. I have helped to successfully install the practice model in three states and a City, contributed to the design and execution of evaluation studies and am currently working on the evaluation of the installation and efficacy of SBC in the South Australia province in Australia and several other US states. We have received funding to conduct this work from the Children's Bureau, Court Improvement Project (CIP) Funds and from various states, countries, and foundations. Across all three of these child welfare areas which sometimes intersect, we have published 70 journal articles, chapters, and proceedings from the annual Berkeley National Human Services Training Evaluation Symposium. Many of the articles have been in visible books published by CSWE and CWLA and in top or influential journals in our field including Child Abuse and Neglect, Children and Youth Services Review, Child Welfare, Journal of Public Child Welfare, Journal of Social Work Education, Administration in Social Work, Training and Development in Human Services, Professional Development, Journal of Health and Human Services Administration, Journal of Human Behavior in the Social Environment, and CW360. We have also published chapters and briefs.

Creating Trauma Informed Systems

Over the last decade our research began to focus on creating trauma-informed systems including addressing racial trauma through anti-racism efforts. In 2011, I was asked by the local child welfare office to determine why turnover was so high. I did an organizational culture and climate audit and included a measure of secondary trauma in the study. I found that half of the staff had PTSD levels of STS which was directly leading to exiting the organization. From 2012-2013 we engaged in an evidence-based intervention, Resilience Alliance, to lower STS and turnover. These efforts were largely successful. In 2012, I worked with a local family court judge to found and Co-Chair a Multidisciplinary Symposium on Childhood Trauma in Louisville. We brought together 150 leaders from all systems (e.g., child welfare, judicial, mental health, schools, health, law enforcement, juvenile justice) and educated them on the events that lead to various types of childhood trauma, symptoms of childhood trauma and ways systems exacerbate traumatic stress in children. We repeated the conference in 2013 with a larger audience of 250 focused on prevention of re-traumatization and expanded the conference to the state in March, 2015 to another 200. The work with DCBS and the Symposia helped us receive a 4-year SAMHSA grant to establish a Childhood Trauma Center in Louisville. The grant allowed a team led by Dr. Bibhuti Sar to create a seamless trauma informed detection (e.g., schools, child welfare, courts) and service delivery system (e.g., mental health, residential childcare) for children and youth who have experienced trauma (particularly child maltreatment, as a refugee). This grant was renewed in 2016 and 2021 for 5 years each. A 2015 OJJDP grant is allowing us to create trauma workgroups across the city to address the trauma of adolescent violence (including involvement in shootings). This grant was expanded to help us address recommendations of a Trauma Audit conducted by the National Council of Juvenile and Family Court Judges to improve the courts and the local youth detention center and help them become more trauma informed. Another grant from HRSA has allowed a team led by a pediatric surgeon, Dr. Mary Fallat, to teach trauma informed skills to first responders such as paramedics, fire fighters and EMS providers dealing with a pediatric death in an out of hospital setting. Because of our groundwork, Metro Louisville along with other colleagues from Kent School received a \$5M SAMHSA grant to continue building trauma knowledge to reduce community violence. As part of the QIC-WD we installed two interventions to reduce STS. Over the last two years we have pivoted to focus on racial trauma through anti-racism efforts. We are just beginning to publish work on trauma in CW360 on Secondary Trauma, the Journal of Loss and Trauma, four papers out in Prehospital Emergency Services, and two book chapters and an article in Child Welfare on anti-racism.

Community Development

Early Childhood

As part of my second practicum, I worked with the state KIDS NOW office which had just launched an early childhood program to enhance early childhood education throughout the Commonwealth of Kentucky. I had previously served on the board of Community Coordinated Child Care (4Cs), a resource and referral agency in Louisville. We received a grant in collaboration with the University of Kentucky to conduct the evaluation of KIDS NOW and remained part of that team until 2007. Recently, in my work with the Bingham Fellows to improve West Louisville, we developed a project to enhance kindergarten readiness in the 40210 zip code area where only 35% of children were kindergarten ready at baseline. My previous work in early childhood education was invaluable in successfully launching that community development project in collaboration with Metro United Way, the Louisville Free Public Library, and Jefferson County Public Schools.

In addition, we have conducted several projects and evaluations of programs to build capacity in youth serving organizations, the local child welfare office and health organizations, co-locate child and family services in Neighborhood Places, assess the impact of fair housing laws and HUD programs such as HOPE VI on residents of disenfranchised neighborhoods and tested the impact of an on-line social work program on access to graduate school for those living in remote areas. Funding for various projects came from the federal Office of Community Services and HUD as well as the state Cabinet for Health and Family Services, local government offices, state and local foundations and the Ash Institute for Governmental Innovation at the Harvard University Kennedy School. We have published 10 journal articles and chapters from this and other miscellaneous work in such journals as Journal of Social Psychology, Journal of Social Work Education, and a Romanian Journal-Social Work Review. Most of my community work has been as a volunteer by supporting community-based organizations such as the Cabbage Patch Settlement House and Kentucky Refugee Ministries or developing and executing projects through the Junior League (JLL) and Leadership Louisville to address various aspects of community need. I am a Kentucky Colonel, am a recipient of the JLL Founders Award and the DCBS Community Partner Award and have been recognized for my contribution to the U of L Signature Partnership Initiative with West Louisville. As a result of my entire body of work, I was inducted as a Fellow into the American Academy of Social Work and Social Welfare in January 2017. In 2019 I received the U of L President's Distinguished Career of Service Award.

Historic Preservation

In 2017 my husband and I purchased a home on the National Historic Register and the Louisville Landmark Commission. The home was built in 1792 by Col. Richard Taylor, father of President Zachary Taylor. Two of my ancestors, Dr. Phillip Moses Russell and Col. Mordecai Sheftall served in the Revolutionary War with George Washington in Valley Forge alongside Col. Richard Taylor.

The home is one of the first completed after the state of Kentucky received independence from Virginia to form its own state. After living there for 3 years, Col. Taylor moved to another part of his property across what is now Brownsboro Rd. to a home that is widely known as Zachary Taylor's childhood home. He sold our house in 1795 to the Herr/Rudy family. In 1820 the Herr/Rudy family completed an addition to the home facing what is now Brownsboro Rd. It is a federalist style. The property changed hands 6 more times until in 1972 the Renau family owned the home until Lynn Renau's death in 2016. We have renovated the home to restore it to its natural beauty and to ensure that it is preserved for years to come. Because the home was likely built, in part, by enslaved people, we plan to erect a plaque and commission a piece of art by Ed Hamilton or another African American artist to commemorate the blood, sweat and tears of the people enslaved by Col. Taylor and Herr in building the sturdy and beautiful home.
