

Mary Ann Millet Outstanding Practicum Student Award

In May of each year at the Kent School convocation following the U of L commencement ceremony one Kent School student is recognized for outstanding performance in practicum. While this recognition is done only at the May graduation, any student graduating in the preceding August or December is also eligible for consideration. The student receives an individual plaque and their name added to the larger plaque maintained on the wall in the lobby of the Kent School.

To be eligible for this award, a student must have a GPA of 3.5 or above; have demonstrated professional behavior (ethical practice, timeliness with assignments, collegial interactions with other social workers/professionals, excellent work with clients/macro assignments, etc.); have demonstrated initiative and creativity in their practicum and have demonstrated self-directed competence in practice.

Students are nominated by practicum faculty liaisons and are selected by faculty vote.
