Behold 1500 Latinos—Everyone Graduates is an all volunteer educational initiative that is our Hispanic Latino partner to the Sisters of Charity of Nazareth Ministry's "Doors to Hope."

We are made up of a collaborative group of Hispanic Latino community leaders from all walks of life—business, government, academic and theological disciplines who are taking it upon ourselves to organize special educational sessions between our Latino youth and a team of tutors to overcome the obstacles that impede progress in planning for higher education and, eventually, a college degree.

We already tested our initiative last year and experienced a great deal of success with our Behold 1500 Latinos—Everyone Graduates Pilot Program. Thanks to Rhonda Buchanan and the U of L Latin American Latino Studies we were able to enlist 16 tutors together with 16 Latino students aged from 14 to 18 and held our sessions for mainly math, english, college enroll-ment preparation and vocational guidance. The tutors paired up one-on-one with students at various classrooms at Jefferson Community Technical College's International Center at 620 S. Third during 10 consecutive Saturday mornings in a row.
