Silvio Fabrykant (Buenos Aires, 1945) is one of Argentina's premier photographers. During his career, which spans four decades, he has taken portraits of major figures of Argentine culture, including artists, musicians, actors, and writers, and has also created publicity ads for magazines, newspaper and other media, and posters for politicians. His portraits of musicians grace the covers of many albums and CDs and were featured in a 25 year retrospective exhibition in Buenos Aires's Recoleta Cultural Center in the summer of 2014. Other one-man shows at the Centro Cultural Recoleta include a 2001 exhibit entitled "Hombres", with portraits in black and white of male cultural figures, and a second exhibit in 2010, "Más hombres," featuring portraits of prominent figures known for their "ausencia de pelo" or "lack of hair". Many of his portraits of Argentine authors appear on book covers and in magazines. One of his favorite subjects is the internationally acclaimed writer Ana María Shua, his wife and the mother of their three daughters. Shua will also present lectures during their visit to the University of Louisville, October 13-15, 2014.
