



- This course focuses on the culture, history, and literature of Central
  American countries (Guatemala, El Salvador, Nicaragua, Honduras,
- Costa Rica, and Panamá) from the 20<sup>th</sup> century to the present. During the 1980s, these countries
- experienced huge political controversies and consequently, there was an explosion of scholarly and journalistic writing during that time. Although these controversies

have been thoroughly documented

in the United States, the cultural production of Central Americans is not as wellknown. This course will cover the most important writers of Central America, such as: Miguel Angel Asturias, Giaconda Belli, Ernesto Cardenal, Carmen Naranjo, and others. The textbook, *Taking Their Word: Literature and the Signs of Central America,* by Arturo Arias, will take us through these authors' literary work.
