Students of this online course will read plays from a diverse group of Latin@ playwrights from a variety of ethnic backgrounds and different regions of the United States. The plays will be analyzed within their historical, political and cultural contexts in order to acquire a better understanding of what Latin@s have to say about themselves and their experiences in the U.S. The course is organized into individual units on three major Hispanic groups residing in this country: Mexican-Americans, Puerto Ricans, and Cuban-Americans, as well as the interactions among their communities. After reading and discussing the plays online, students will be evaluated by daily assignments, two exams, and two discussion boards.
