Relator – the yarn

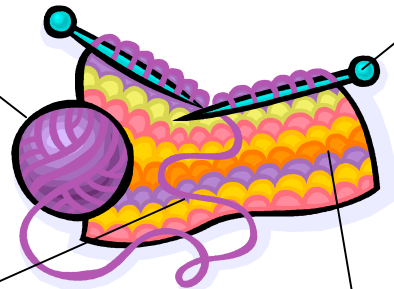
This represents valuing the relationship in making my decisions. The relationship is woven throughout the finished product. Relationships are why decisions need to be made thoughtfully.

Having enough information to feel confident that a good decision is being made.

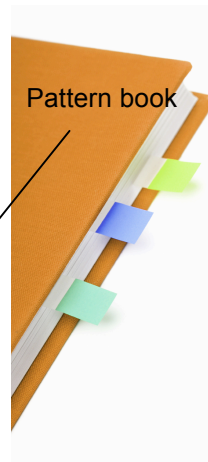
Consistency – the pattern
