

Bibliographic Citations for Archival Photograph Resources

The items which should be included when you cite primary sources are:

- 1. The item reference:** Contains: a) identifying information which is unique to the item - title or description; b) the name of the collection - sometimes called "record group," "fonds," or "series"; the location of the item within the collection - "Box 6, Folder 3, etc."
- 2. The repository reference:** The name and location of the archival repository, historical society, library, etc. which owns the collection from which your item came.
