

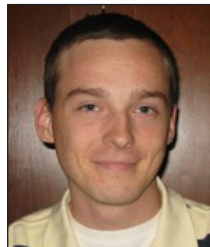

- ▶ **Service.** Scholars make it a point to give back to their communities, accumulating 400 combined hours of community service each semester.

- ▶ Two U.S. presidents; the Chief Justice of the U.S. Supreme Court; fourteen U.S. Senators; six ambassadors and foreign dignitaries; eight U.S. cabinet members; and numerous authors, scholars, and policy experts

McConnell Scholars have received financial assistance to study in:

- ▶ China, Ecuador, England, Ghana, Italy, Japan, Kenya, and Scotland (just to list a few)
