Class activities will include in class presentations by students and online discussions based on assigned reading when not meeting.

# **Teaching toolbox**

Students will choose four methods of instruction/instructional strategies that they could use for the Method course. Students will submit a 1-paragraph summary about each following example below.

Clustering submitted by Pascale Alard

Major, Harris & Zakrajsek Teaching for Learning, 2016, p116-118

- Students are given information about concepts, and move around the room to transfer learned information to other students, looking for connections and links between concepts which allow them to form clusters.
- Method is helpful for understanding and recalling information and supports student networking and collaboration with the advantage of having every student participate.
- Limited to classroom with sufficient open space. Apply to all group size.

#### Lesson plan and powerpoint

Students will develop a lesson plan (based on provided example during class) and a powerpoint by revising or creating a lecture for the Method course. The lesson plan/powerpoint should incorporate the instructional strategies/method of instruction reviewed in this course. Clarity, organization, opportunity for students to retrieve/connect information, opportunity to engage students, and opportunity for practice will be evaluated using a 0-6 scale (0-2 not achieved, 3-4 somewhat achieved, 5-6 achieved).

#### Assessment

Present your plan for formative and summative assessment. Level of preparation and clarity will be evaluated using a 0-4 scale (0-1 poor, 2-3 good, 4 very good).

#### In class activities

Present your plan for in class activities including any assigned work before the class. Level of preparation, content understanding, student engagement and communication skills will be evaluated by peers using a 0-4 scale (0-1 poor, 2-3 good, 4 very good).

## **Powerpoint presentation**

Deliver a 30-minute component of your developed lesson. Provide context by describing where the lesson falls within the semester curriculum, any assigned work, and planned activities. Level of preparation, content understanding, student engagement and communication skills will be evaluated by peers using a 0-4 scale (0-1 poor, 2-3 good, 4 very good).
