

versity College Cork with a medical degree in 2016. 🗼 I work in the laboratory of Susan Galandiuk, M.D. in ★ the Price Institute of Surgical Research where we ★ examine both benign and malignant diseases of the gastrointestinal tract. My principal research goal is to identify long non-coding RNA which are dysregulated in colon cancer and to describe how their expression can change tumor behavior. Additionally, we are working on a number of clinical studies to examine questions posed by clinical practice. I have ★ been fortunate to present some of our work at local ★ conferences (Kentucky Chapter of the American Col-★ lege of Surgeons), and I will be presenting data in Houston, Atlanta, and potentially in England this coming year. My plans are to graduate with my Ph.D. and to use the skills gained in Louisville to pursue a career in academic surgery.

Recipe of the Month:

Red Velvet Poke Cake

Ingredients:

(For the cake)

🕨 8 Tbsp. unsalted butter, at room temperature

1 1/2 c. granulated sugar

👂 2 eggs

5 Tbsp. unsweetened cocoa powder

6 Tbsp. red food coloring

1 tsp. vanilla extract

1 c. buttermilk

2 1/4 c. all-purpose flour

1 tsp. salt

1 tsp. baking soda

1 Tbsp. distilled white vinegar

14 oz. can sweetened condensed milk

(For the frosting)

1 c. salted butter, at room temperature

8 oz. cream cheese, at room temperature


3 1/2 c. powdered sugar

2 Tbsp. vanilla extract

Directions:

Make the Cake: Preheat oven to 350 degrees. Lightly grease a 9 x 13 -inch baking pan. Cream the butter and sugar with mixer until light and fluffy, about 3 minutes. Add the eggs and beat until well incorporated. In a separate small bowl, mix together the cocoa powder, vanilla extract and red food coloring to make a thick paste. Add to the batter and mix until completely combined. Reduce mixer speed to low and slowly add half of the buttermilk. Add half of the flour and mix until combined. Repeat the process with the remaining milk and flour. Beat on high until smooth, about one minute. Add salt, baking soda and vinegar. Beat for another 2 minutes until combined and smooth. Pour batter into the baking pan. Bake until knife or toothpick inserted into the center comes out clean, about 25 to 30 minutes. Remove cake from oven and immediately poke holes all over the top with a skewer or end of a spoon. Pour can of condensed milk over the top. Allow cake to cool before adding frosting.

Make the frosting: Whip the butter and cream cheese on high speed for 5 minutes. Reduce the speed and slowly add powdered sugar until all is incorporated. Add the vanilla and mix to combine. Increase speed and whip for a few minutes until the frosting is light and fluffy. Spread the frosting evenly over the top of the cake and decorate as desired. Recipe by: browneyedbaker.com
