

RESIDENT MEDICAL LICENSURE

Types of licenses available to U of L residents and fellows:

Note: PG 1 residents are not licensed in the state of Kentucky

Institutional Practice License (IP)

- Does **NOT** allow moonlighting or a DEA number
- Resident has to have completed 1 year of accredited residency training and passed Steps 1 and 2
- Available only to residents and fellows participating in an accredited training program.

Residency Training License (RT)

- Allows moonlighting that is approved by the program director
- Allows resident to have a DEA number
- Resident has to have completed 1 year of accredited residency training and passed Steps 1, 2, and 3
- Available only to residents and fellows participating in an accredited training program.

Regular (Full) License

- Allows same privileges as RT license, but does not require current participation in a training program.
- Resident has to have completed 2 years of accredited residency train and passed Steps 1, 2, and 3.

Temporary License

- Issued for the interim period between completion of a Full license application and approval by the Kentucky Board of Medical Licensure (KBML)
- Not available for IP or RT licenses. These must be approved by the KBML before being issued. The KBML meets 4 times per year.

INCOMING RESIDENT LICENSURE

All residents who are PG level 2 or higher **MUST** be licensed by the state of Kentucky in order to start training. These individuals are responsible for their own license applications fees and any other required fees (FCVS, etc.) Copies of licenses should be forwarded to the GME office as soon as possible.

Incoming residents and fellows who require Kentucky licensure should contact Kathy Sandman in the GME office for instructions **as soon as their contract is signed.**

Kathy can advise you on which license to apply for and how to obtain a license in the most timely manner.
