

Music Fee - \$175 per semester, pro-rated

PURPOSE

To offset direct expenditures exclusively related to music majors including but not limited to student accompanists, technology and infrastructure, student activities, and student tickets for concerts and performances. Other initiatives and benefits may be offered as funding permits and opportunities arise.

DIRECT BENEFITS TO MUSIC STUDENTS

- **Access to four, one-hour services each semester with a staff piano accompanist.** For information about this program see Associate Dean Oliphant. A list of approved staff accompanists is available from all applied music studio teachers who can also answer questions about the program. Use or lose this benefit, as unclaimed accompanist services do not carry over to succeeding academic years.
- **Enrollment in half-hour, secondary instrument applied music lessons on a space available/ permission of secondary instructor / permission of major teacher basis for four semesters during the undergraduate degree or two semesters during the master's degree.** Inquire about this program with Associate Dean Oliphant. Remember that permission to register for secondary applied music lessons is contingent on approval from both the major applied teacher as well as the secondary teacher from whom lessons are being sought. Use or lose this benefit, as unclaimed lessons do not carry over to succeeding academic years.
- **Creation of a technology fund earmarked for maintaining appropriate technology resources in School of Music classrooms and laboratories.**
- **Creation of a pool of free student tickets to Louisville Ballet, Chamber Music Society, Kentucky Opera, Speed Concert Series, Louisville Orchestra Classics events. Free admission to other special events will also be made available to eligible music students throughout the year.** There is no limit on number of events you may attend on this basis, but you are entitled to only one free ticket per event.

HOW TO OBTAIN FREE TICKETS

Step 1: At the beginning of every semester you are enrolled, go to the Dean's Office and request a School of Music Student ID card. Its purpose is to verify to participating arts organizations that you are eligible for free tickets by virtue of having paid the music fee. This card is different from your UofL ID/Cardinal Card. After obtaining a card in the fall, you must have it validated again in the Dean's Office at the beginning of the spring semester. Brand new cards will be issued every academic year. Take care to not lose this card . . . it's your free ticket!

Step 2: Consult the School of Music website and/or lobby for a current list of events that you may attend for free. Faculty may recommend or require you to attend certain events.

Step 3: On the date of the concert, go to the specific performance venue, present both your UofL ID card and your School of Music ID card at the ticket window, and ask for your free ticket. There is NO advance ticketing for any event. You are advised to arrive at least 30 minutes before showtime.
