APPOINTMENT: Although duties will lie primarily in the canon of Western musicology before 1750 or after 1900, we encourage applications from individuals with a range of research specialties. Responsibilities include undergraduate and graduate courses as well as independent projects and theses; research and publication; and service to the university, community and profession. Experience with distance learning and familiarity with recent classroom technology tools will be an advantage. This is a full-time, tenure-track position with comprehensive benefits package. Salary and duties are commensurate with qualifications and experience.

QUALIFICATIONS: Ph.D. in musicology or a degree deemed to be equivalent by the School of Music. In addition, post-doctoral teaching experience, a promising record of publications, and demonstrated excellence in teaching are all desirable.

The **University of Louisville** is Kentucky's premier, nationally recognized metropolitan research university in the state's largest urban area. With a national reputation for its high-quality undergraduate programs and over twenty nationally recognized research, graduate, and professional programs, the University also has as a strong commitment to the community in which it resides. The School is also home to the Grawemeyer Award for Music Composition, one of the most prestigious international prizes for composers. Musicology is taught within the Division of Music History in the School of Music. The Dwight Anderson Music Library, housing the largest academic music collection in the state of Kentucky, includes an archive of materials related to the Grawemeyer Award as well as the Ricasoli Collection of 400 European manuscripts and editions from the 18th and early 19th centuries. The school also enjoys a collaborative arrangement with the Karol Szymanowski Academy of Music in Katowice, Poland. The city of Louisville offers hospitality, warmth and smaller city advantages like shorter commutes and lower cost of living alongside major city amenities including a full range of performing arts, great collegiate athletic teams, an impressive array of dining possibilities, and a nationally-acclaimed parks system.
