- APPOINTMENT:** The successful candidate will teach undergraduate and graduate applied voice. Additional duties may include courses in diction, vocal literature, vocal pedagogy, and opera workshop/theatre. Maintain ongoing creative/scholarly activity and performance visibility in the region and at the national and international levels. Engage in service to the university, community and profession. This is a full-time, tenure-track position with comprehensive benefits package. Rank, salary, and duties are commensurate with qualifications and experience.
- QUALIFICATIONS:** Excellence in teaching private voice at the university level and significant performance experience. Minimum academic requirement is MM in Voice Performance. Completed doctorate or equivalent in professional experience is preferred.
