UNIVERSITY OF LOUISVILLE SCHOOL OF MUSIC

The Kentuckiana Music Institute provides an opportunity for intense choral, orchestral, wind ensemble or keyboard experience. This experience is offered by the University of Louisville School of Music for the small service cost of only \$125.00 to those who can qualify. Students must have finished grade 8, 9, 10, 11, or 12 and may apply even if they graduate in May or June. Admission is by audition only. To gain admission, prospective students should fill out and return the application form. Upon receipt of the application form, arrangements can be made for an audition in the student's school or community through June 1, 2000. Tapes are accepted through April 1, 2000.

The choral curriculum consists of large ensemble rehearsals, sectionals, small ensemble rehearsals, voice classes, and movement classes daily. A portion of the time will be devoted to learning the audition piece for the Kentucky All-State choral program.

The keyboard curriculum consists of keyboard master class, performance practice, organ class, improvisation class, and ensemble class daily. Keyboard students must have two or three pieces ready to work on at the Institute.

The instrumental curriculum consists of large ensemble rehearsals, sectionals, small ensemble rehearsals, and daily private practice.

Registration

Registration of all students begins on Sunday, June 18, at 1:00 p.m. and continues until 3:00 p.m. Instruction begins at 3:00 p.m. and ends at 9:00 p.m. with a break for the evening meal. Monday through Friday classes begin at 8:00 a.m. and end at 9:00 p.m. with breaks for noon and evening meals. The event concludes on Saturday, June 24 with a Grand Finale Concert.

All programs have a limited enrollment, so it is best to apply and audition as early as possible.

Keyboard enrollment will be limited to 16 students. Vocal registration will be limited to 100 singers, 25 each of soprano, alto, tenor, and bass. Instrumental enrollment will be limited to 30 violins, 12 violas, 12 cellos, 8 double basses, 12 horns, 12 trumpets, 8 trombones, 5 euphoniums, 5 tubas, 8 flutes, 2 piccolos, 4 oboes, 18 clarinets, an English horn, 8 saxophones, 6 bassoons, 2 harpists, and 5 percussionists. Two separate wind groups, a concert band and a wind ensemble will be formed.

Two half-hour private lessons on any instrument or voice are available as an option to students for an additional charge of \$30.

Housing
On-campus room and board (includes breakfast, lunch and dinner) is available for all students for \$190. The commuter meal plan (for lunch and dinner only) is available at a reduced cost of \$75.

There will be supervised activities for dormitory students on all evenings during any free time. Male and female counselors are always with students and will be present in the dormitory.
