### **Work in Progress**

**I am still working on another article that focuses on the philosophy of health and wellness that guided Eldress Sally Loomis, one of the leaders of the Harvard Shaker Community in Harvard, Massachusetts. Eldress Sally rejected 19<sup>th</sup> century views of women as weak and prone to illness and collaborated with Dr. Harriot Hunt (one of the earliest female physicians in America and a women's rights advocate) to promote an ideal of Shaker sisters as robust and healthy. Together, they pursued what we would call a holistic approach to medicine within the Shaker community and foreshadow contemporary mind-body approaches to health and wellness. This and the above publications grew out of a book I am writing on the Shakers: *Earth and Spirit, Nature and Grace: Shaker Health Practices*.**

This is probably a long shot, but I would like to prepare an article length version of my research on the health practices of the Shakers for the *Journal of the American Medical Association* or the *New England Journal of Medicine*.
