

GENERAL EDUCATION COURSE CODES

Course code designations (WC, B, A, CL, CD1, CD2) may appear in a course title (as an extension of the title) for many of the General Education courses. These internal codes are used for tracking purposes. Other codes (H, M, S, SL, OC, SB) do not appear in the course title but are recognized as general education code designations in the official course inventory maintained by the Council on Postsecondary Education (CPE). Both sets of codes indicate the general education requirement(s) that the course fulfills. Some courses are assigned more than one code if they fulfill more than one requirement. The codes can be interpreted as meeting the following General Education Requirements (GERs):

GER Codes in the Titles

- WC** -- Written Communication
- B** -- Built-in Lab/no separate lab course under Natural Sciences Requirement
- A** -- “Arts” Course under Arts & Humanities Requirement
- CL** -- Computer & Information Literacy
- CD1** -- Race/Ethnic Specific Course under Cultural Diversity Requirement
- CD2** -- Other Cultural Diversity Courses

- H** -- “Humanities” Course under Arts & Humanities Requirement
- M** -- Mathematics
- S** -- Natural Sciences
