Bruce F. Adams, Ph.D., Professor of History; sabbatical leave of absence with full pay, August 1, 2008 through December 31, 2008. (Dr. Adams will be researching and writing his study of the repatriation of Russians from China, and editing the *Supplement to the Modern Encyclopedia of Russian, Soviet, and Eurasian History*.)

Ann T. Allen, Ph.D., Professor of History; sabbatical leave of absence with half pay, August 1, 2008 through May 31, 2009. (Dr. Allen will be doing a book-length study of the kindergarten in Germany and the United States from its origins in Germany in the 1840s down to the 1920s.)

D. Mark Austin, Ph.D., Associate Professor of Sociology; sabbatical leave of absence with full pay, August 1, 2008 through December 31, 2008. (Dr. Austin will continue his ongoing project which focuses on issues of community in particular the subculture of respondents that live a geographically mobile life.)

Julie Berman, Ph.D., Assistant Professor of Communication; sabbatical leave of absence with full pay, August 1, 2008 through December 31, 2008 (contingent on successful outcome of promotion and tenure review). (Dr. Berman will be working on two book chapters to study the Welcome Weekend phenomenon introduced to the University and an analysis of framing devices for performance in everyday life as depicted in various mass media venues.)

Beth A. Boehm, Ph.D., Professor of English; sabbatical leave of absence with full pay, July 1, 2008 through December 31, 2008. (Dr. Boehm will explore the question of why we teach literature in order to articulate ways of teaching it better.)

Danielle D. Brown, Ph.D.; change of appointment from Instructor to Assistant Professor of Psychological and Brain Sciences (Term), November 1, 2007. (due to completion of Ph.D.)

Richard Todd Burns, M.F.A., Associate Professor of Fine Arts; sabbatical leave of absence with full pay, August 1, 2008 through December 31, 2008. (Dr. Burns will explore his process of combining ceramic and metal into multimedia pieces. He plans to produce a 15 piece series and submit them for exhibition by Fall 2009.)

Anne Caldwell, Ph.D., Associate Professor of Political Science; sabbatical leave of absence with full pay, January 1, 2009 through May 31, 2009. (Dr. Caldwell will work toward completion of a book manuscript that examines new forms of authority, identity, and domination located in global practices and discourses surrounding human rights and humanitarian intervention.)

Margaret M. Carreiro, Ph.D., Associate Professor of Biology; sabbatical leave of absence with full pay, January 1, 2009 through May 31, 2009. (Dr. Carreiro will learn new tools to further recent research in restoration ecology and to enhance her established program in urban ecosystem ecology and consolidate and synthesize research conducted over the last eight years in urban ecology.)

Cara H. Cashon, Ph.D., Assistant Professor of Psychological and Brain Sciences; medical leave with pay, December 11, 2007 through February 15, 2008.

Karen M. Chandler, Ph.D., Associate Professor of English; sabbatical leave of absence with full pay, January 1, 2009 through May 31, 2009. (Dr. Chandler will focus on two projects. The first is to revise a paper on children's literature for publication on a collection of folk stories from the African-American tradition and to research a book chapter on treatments of the Civil Rights Movement.)

H. Stow Chapman, M.S., Associate Professor of Fine Arts; sabbatical leave of absence with full pay, August 1, 2008 through December 31, 2008. (Mr. Chapman will continue his professional activities including furniture design, printmaking, drawing, painting, research, and environmental observation. He will produce an exhibit of the works for display upon his return.)

Karen Christopher, Ph.D., Associate Professor of Women's and Gender Studies and Associate Professor of Sociology; sabbatical leave of absence with half pay, August 1, 2008 through May 31, 2009. (Dr. Christopher will work on two projects. The first is an ongoing research project on welfare recipients attending the University of Louisville. The second and main focus is her recent project, *For Love of Work, Family, or Country: Contextualizing Mothers' Employment Decisions* which consists of in-depth interviews with U.S. and Canadian mothers with young children.)

Geoffrey Cross, Ph.D., Professor of English; sabbatical leave of absence with full pay, August 1, 2008 through December 31, 2008. (Dr. Cross will finalize revisions of his book under contract with SUNY Press, *Envisioning Collaboration: Group Verbal-Visual Composing in a System of Creativity*.)

Matthieu Dalle, Ph.D., Assistant Professor of Classical and Modern Languages; sabbatical leave of absence with full pay, August 1, 2008 through December 31, 2008. (Dr. Dalle will travel to Paris, France, to conduct research and continue work on his project entitled "The Voice of our Community: Abbesses Echo, a Parisian Underground Radio Station." Dr. Dalle's work will result in at least one or two articles and one or two conference presentations.)

Donald B. Dupre, Ph.D., Professor of Chemistry; rescission of sabbatical leave of absence with full pay which had been approved for January 1, 2007 through May 31, 2007.

Louise January Elder, M.S.; reappointment as Instructor in English (Term), January 1, 2008 through May 31, 2008.

Stuart L. Esrock, Ph.D., Associate Professor of Communication; sabbatical leave of absence with half pay, August 1, 2008 through May 31, 2009. (Dr. Esrock plans to conduct a study of strategic communication within a non-profit organization that focuses on public health improvement. Dr. Esrock's research will result in multiple articles submitted to refereed journals and book chapters.)

Edward A. Essock, Ph.D., Professor of Psychology; sabbatical leave of absence with full pay, August 1, 2008 through December 31, 2008. (Dr. Essock's goals for this sabbatical are: 1. develop a mathematical description of visual processing as a function of orientation; 2. examine visual channels across visual information; 3. examine different types of suppression, and 4. link these findings with neural units underlying perception.)

Capt. Stacey Ewing, B.S., Park University; Assistant Professor of Aerospace Science, July 1, 2008 through June 30, 2011. (Gratis)

Jasmine L Farrier, Ph.D., Assistant Professor of Political Science; sabbatical leave of absence with full pay, January 1, 2009 through May 31, 2009. (Dr.

Farrier will work on two projects. The first is completion of her current book project and the second to focus on her second book, tentatively entitled *Congressional Ambivalence and the New Separation of Powers*.)

Jennifer Gregg, Ph.D., Assistant Professor of Communication; sabbatical leave of absence with full pay, January 1, 2009 through May 31, 2009. (Dr. Gregg plans to teach research methods and science communication at the University of Reykjavik. At the completion of the semester, she will travel to Akureyri and other rural locations to conduct interviews with businesses and individuals to understand how rural residents have successfully used technology for business and social support.)

Jafar Hadizadeh, Ph.D., Professor of Geography & Geosciences; sabbatical leave of absence with half pay, August 1, 2008 through May 31, 2009. (Dr. Hadizadeh will develop ideas for modeling mechanical behavior of the San Andreas Fault zone based on microstructural and analytical data. At least twice during the sabbatical period he will attend national disciplinary meetings to present the group's results as well as presenting data to the EarthScope national meeting.)

Zijiang He, Ph.D., Professor of Psychological and Brain Sciences; sabbatical leave of absence with half pay, August 1, 2008 through May 31, 2009. (Dr. He's research goals are: 1) further increase his research productivity, 2) to write and submit an NIH grant proposal, 3) test a new set of patients in a new line of research at the Pennsylvania College of Optometry, 4) learn new fMRI techniques at the Eastern China Normal University and conduct new studies in cognitive neuroscience, and 5) organize a scientific workshop at the University of Louisville in Fall, 2008.)

Wesley G. Jennings, M.C.J., University of South Carolina, (Ph.D. expected December 2007 from University of Florida); Instructor in Justice Administration (Term), January 1, 2008 through June 30, 2008, and Assistant Professor of Justice Administration (Probationary), July 1, 2008.

Debra S. Journet, Ph.D., Professor of English; sabbatical leave of absence with full pay, January 1, 2009 through May 31, 2009. (Dr. Journet will work on two projects. The first is a theoretical argument that learning is, itself, a kind of narrative action. The second project is a multimodal essay which documents instances of learning as enactive narrative.)

Tracy E. K'Meyer, Ph.D., Associate Professor of History; sabbatical leave of absence with full pay, January 1, 2009 through May 31, 2009. (Dr. K'Meyer will conduct research on *Friendly Dissent: The American Friends Service Committee and the Fight Against War, Poverty, and Racism*.)

Karen L. Kopelson, Ph.D., Associate Professor of English; sabbatical leave of absence with full pay, August 1, 2008 through December 31, 2008. (Dr. Kopelson will complete two article-length projects, *The rhetoric of identification and religious conversion in AA texts* and *The rhetoric of doctor/patient interaction in the age of the "e-patient"*.)

Steven Koven, Ph.D., Professor of Urban and Public Affairs and Director of the Master of Public Administration Program; sabbatical leave of absence with full pay, August 1, 2008 through December 31, 2008. (Dr. Koven's objective is to complete two chapters for a proposed book that will focus on codes of ethics and expectations of proper behavior for specific cohorts in public sector employees.)

Kiseop Lee, Ph.D., Assistant Professor of Mathematics; sabbatical leave of absence with half pay, August 1, 2008 through May 31, 2009 (contingent on successful outcome of promotion and tenure review). (Dr. Lee would like to continue his current research and widen his research focus to more practical interdisciplinary studies.)

Alan C. Leidner, Ph.D., Professor of Classical and Modern Languages; sabbatical leave of absence with full pay, January 1, 2009 through May 31, 2009. (Dr. Leidner will begin a project based on the theory of the fairy tale he developed applying what he has discovered about the fairy tale to the cinematic fairy tale adaptations produced by the Walt Disney Corporation.)

Benjamin Mast, Ph.D., Associate Professor of Psychological and Brain Sciences; sabbatical leave of absence with full pay, January 1, 2009 through May 31, 2009. (Dr. Mast plans to complete a book on the psychological experiences of persons diagnosed with dementia.)

Susan Matarese, Ph.D., Professor of Political Science; sabbatical leave of absence with full pay, August 1, 2008 through December 31, 2008. (Dr. Matarese will conduct research for an article that will focus upon the "utopian" vision of the Christian Reconstructionists.)

Peter Morrin, M.F.A., Princeton University; Associate Professor, College of Arts and Sciences (Term), October 1, 2007 through September 30, 2008.
