(Dr. Beggan plans to develop a new line of research in the study of pop culture: the social psychology of the current trends in popular dancing, including issues of gender and sexuality, identity and psychometrics.)

(Dr. Dupré will conduct research in Leipzig, Germany and Santa Fe, Argentina enriching his background in theoretical description of Electron Paramagnetic Resonance phenomena.)

Perri K. Eason, Ph.D., Professor of Biology; sabbatical leave of absence with full pay, August 1, 2009 through December 31, 2009. (Dr. Eason will work with Dr. Elizabeth Jakob in her laboratory researching the fighting behavior in saltacids through use of video imagery and construct a dynamic model to test her hypotheses. Her work will be published and presented at national and international meetings.)

Paul Ewald, Ph.D., Professor of Biology; sabbatical leave of absence with full pay, January 1, 2010 through May 31, 2010. (Dr. Ewald plans to complete a monograph in the area in the evolution of cancer and his research will facilitate his teaching of Chronic Disease Biology.)

Linda Marie Gigante, Ph.D., Associate Professor of Fine Arts; sabbatical leave of absence with full pay, January 1, 2010 through May 31, 2010. (Dr. Gigante will continue her research on the Roman funerary objects in the Speed Museum, complete an article on the twelve marble ash urns in the Speed and submit it for publication.)

Paul F. Griner, M.A., Associate Professor of English; sabbatical leave of absence with full pay, August 1, 2009 through December 31, 2009. (Professor Griner will thoroughly revise a manuscript for his novel, *Fifty Pair of Starlings*.)

Gerald B. Hammond, Ph.D., Professor of Chemistry; change from leave of absence without pay, September 15, 2008 through September 14, 2009 to leave of absence with pay, September 15, 2008 through September 14, 2009.
