Beginning Friday, **October 1**, IT will upgrade the PeopleSoft Student Administration/Human Resources (SA/HR) system to version 9.0. During the upgrade, which will occur over approximately 5-6 days (including the weekend), users will be unable to access PeopleSoft SA/HR system and ULink self-services such as paycheck viewing, degree application, and class schedule viewing. Version 9.0 offers the ability to print paychecks in PDF format and "enrollment backpack," a service which allows students to track degree progress in ULink.
