SPEED SCHOOL PRIVATELY-FUNDED SCHOLARSHIPS

The J. B. Speed School of Engineering endeavors to assist capable and deserving students in financing their education. This support is made possible through a number of privately-endowed scholarships ranging from textbook assistance to full tuition.

Scholarship applicants must be admitted to Speed School and have a minimum ACT composite of 25 and high school GPA of 3.35. Initial awards and continuance of Speed School financial aid are dependent on the student's full-time enrollment, scholastic record, financial need, and the availability of funds.

Additional requirements include a résumé highlighting the applicant's academic and extracurricular achievements and two letters of recommendation from individuals [non-family members] familiar with the applicant's credentials. All credentials must be postmarked by **January 15**.

SPEED SCHOOL WORK GRANTS

Students who receive Speed School funds, (not affiliated with the Federal Work-Study Program) work in a Speed School office or laboratory five or ten hours per week. Students must submit an application at the beginning of each semester. Funds earned through this program are applied to the student's University account.

Awards are renewable each year provided the student meets grade-point average criteria. Cardinal Covenant

U of L's Cardinal Covenant program helps students from low-income families fund their tuition, room, board, and books with assistance from federal, state, private, and U of L sources. Students should submit a Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA), available through their guidance office or on-line at www.fafsa.ed.gov, by **February 15**.

KCTCS Academic Transfer Scholarship

UNIVERSITY FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE (CONTINUED)

SCHOLARSHIPS FOR OUT-OF-STATE FRESHMEN

Non-residents of Kentucky admitted to University of Louisville are automatically considered for the following awards; a scholarship application is not required.

National Scholars Program

Upon admission to the University of Louisville, incoming freshmen from outside Kentucky who have a minimum ACT composite of 26 or combined CR+M SAT score of 1170 and a 3.35 GPA on a 4.0 scale will be awarded a \$10,000 annual scholarship. The award is valued at \$50,000 over the course of the Master of Engineering program. A scholarship application is not required, but seniors must apply for admission by **February 15**.

Indiana Scholars

This is a reciprocity program whereby students from Clark, Crawford, Floyd, Harrison, Scott, and Washington counties pay in-state tuition.
