#### Course Objective:

In Latin 202 the student will continue to review Latin grammar and translate classical Latin texts. Class objectives will be accomplished through a combination of reading, composition, and grammatical analysis. The objectives of this class are:

- 1. to continue to learn the fundamentals of Latin grammar;
- 2. to continue to learn the construction of English grammar;
- 3. to enable the student to translate primary Latin materials.
- 4. to inform the student of research materials for classical and medieval studies at the Ekstrom Library and to learn how to access them
