



Financial Aid Timeline

We encourage you to complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) at fafsa.gov as soon as it is available for the term you plan to enter the University of Louisville. Look below for the term you wish to begin school at UofL for important dates that will help you through the financial aid process.



Spring 2017

- ▶ File the 2016-2017 FAFSA now or if you are already in school, request that your FAFSA data be sent to UofL
- ▶ Priority deadline to have a complete financial aid file: **October 1, 2016**
- ▶ UofL begins to send financial aid notifications to students with complete files in **late November**
- ▶ First day of classes: **January 9, 2017**



Summer 2017

- ▶ File the 2016-2017 FAFSA now or if you are already in school, request that your FAFSA data be sent to UofL
- ▶ Complete the UofL request form for summer federal financial aid. This form is available at ulink.louisville.edu in mid-April. Your account will be available once you have applied to UofL.
- ▶ Priority deadline to have a complete financial aid file: **April 1, 2017**
- ▶ UofL begins to send financial aid notifications for summer in **late April**
- ▶ Summer terms begin: **May 8 - July 5, 2017**



Fall 2017

- ▶ File the 2017-2018 FAFSA. It will be available on **October 1, 2016**. Some federal and state aid programs have limited funding and award based on the date you file your FAFSA.
- ▶ Deadline for scholarships vary. See pages 7-8.
- ▶ UofL begins to send financial aid notifications to transfer students in **early June**.
- ▶ First day of classes: **August 21, 2017**

Applying for Financial Aid

1

File or update (FAFSA) as soon as possible. UofL's school code is 001999.

Check your UofL e-mail account and your ULink "To Do List" to monitor financial aid communications. To view your "To Do List" visit ulink.louisville.edu and select the Student Services tab. For complete instructions on how to access your online services, visit louisville.edu/admissions/activate.

3

You may be selected for verification. If you were selected for verification at your last school, you will be selected for verification at UofL. You must complete verification to be eligible for federal financial aid. If selected, you can find the necessary forms and instructions on ULink.

4

Once the Student Financial Aid Office receives your FAFSA results, we will assemble a financial aid package that may include a combination of federal grants, loans and work-study programs.

5

You must be degree-seeking to apply for financial aid. Post-baccalaureate and Continuing Studies students are not eligible for financial aid. Students seeking their second bachelor's degree are eligible for loans.

To be awarded in a timely manner, you must complete the financial aid process, enroll at UofL, and cancel any pending financial aid at other institutions 30-45 days prior to UofL's first disbursement date of the semester.

Report additional aid, including third party payments—additional aid may result in an adjustment in your federal, state, or institutional aid. Veteran's benefits do not need to be reported. Report aid online: louisville.edu/financialaid

Most financial aid awards are projected for full-time enrollment. If you enroll in fewer than 12 hours, you may have your financial aid adjusted. You must be enrolled in at least six hours to be eligible for aid such as the FSEOG, federal work study and loans.

It is important to maintain a **3.0 GPA** when transferring to UofL in order to maintain eligibility for KEES funds and to qualify for our Continuing Student Scholarships. KEES funds must be used within five years of high school graduation and are only available to students who graduated in 2000 or after. Transfer work is not calculated in your UofL GPA, but it is used to determine initial scholarship eligibility.

Scholarships for Adult/ Transfer Students



KCTCS Academic Transfer Scholarship

- ▶ For Kentucky community college transfer students
- ▶ **Deadline:** April 15
- ▶ uofl.me/kctcs-transfer-scholarship

UofL offers an academic scholarship for students transferring from any KCTCS institution or from Ivy Tech Community College, Sellersburg. Students must have 40 or more transferable hours and a 3.25 GPA. Awards range from \$500 to \$3,000.



National Transfer Scholarship

- ▶ **Deadline:** July 1 / December 1
- ▶ uofl.me/nsp-costs

UofL offers an academic scholarship for out-of-state transfer students. Students must have a minimum of 24 transferable hours and a 3.0 GPA. Available for spring and fall admits. Awards range from \$5,000 to \$7,500.



Bernard Osher Re-Entry Scholarship

- ▶ **Deadline:** June 1
- ▶ uofl.me/osher-reentry

This program provides funds to students working on their first undergraduate degree and who experienced a hiatus in their education of five or more years. Awards range up to \$5,000.



New Beginnings Scholarship

- ▶ **Deadline:** March 15
- ▶ louisville.edu/financialaid/scholarships

This scholarship is awarded to Kentucky residents who demonstrate financial need. Recipients must no longer be supported by parents and must return to college after a break in their education of at least one year.



Beth K. Fields Scholarship

- ▶ **Deadline:** March 15
- ▶ louisville.edu/alumni/scholarships/alumni.html

This program provides funds to students at least 25 years old who provide support for at least one dependent and have 12 credit hours of college work with a 3.0 GPA.



Go Higher Grant

- ▶ **Deadline:** Apply as soon as possible
- ▶ www.kheaa.com

The Go Higher Grant awards students up to \$1,000 for one academic year when they enroll at UofL part-time. The award covers tuition and a book allowance of \$50 per credit hour. To be eligible, students must be Kentucky residents, at least 24 years old, and demonstrate financial need. May be awarded fall or spring.

UPS Employment Tuition Reimbursement Program

UPS offers two tuition-assistance programs to part-time employees: Metropolitan College and Earn & Learn.

- The Metropolitan College program pays 100% tuition to UofL or JCTC.
- The Earn & Learn program pays up to \$5,250 annually. Participants can work at UPS in the next-day air operation and receive wages with benefits.

*A reciprocal agreement between Kentucky and Indiana allows residents of Clark, Crawford, Floyd, Harrison, Perry, Scott and Washington counties to pay in-state tuition rates.

If the initial determination of residency status is non-resident, a student may request a residency determination review.
