

FACULTY SPOTLIGHT: DR. ANGELA STOREY

I am a cultural anthropologist, and my research focuses on the politics of urban environments. I've been doing research in South Africa about social movements and community access to water, sanitation, and electricity since 2010, and in Louisville I have worked on projects about residential solar energy, climate justice, participatory governance, and voluntary cemetery management, among other topics! I enjoy collaborative research and have had the privilege to do work alongside a number of colleagues in Anthropology and other departments, as well as with many



excellent undergraduate and graduate students. I came to academia by way of community organizing, heading to graduate school after working for environmental groups in Washington, California, Georgia, Connecticut, and Massachusetts. That background has shaped my own approach to research, which is at the intersection of applied and engaged scholarship. I see research as critical to building a just world and am excited to begin 2024 as the new Director of the UofL's Anne Braden Institute for Social Justice Research. I will continue to teach in ANTH and do research as usual, but am looking forward to engaging through the ABI with new projects as well.

Beyond anthropology, I love to travel, be in the out of doors, and read fiction of all kinds. Part of my sabbatical in Fall 2023 was spent in Sweden with my husband, seeking out the snow.
