## **FACULTY SPOTLIGHT: DR. THOMAS JENNINGS**

I'm an Associate Professor of anthropology and directing the Center for Archaeology and Cultural Heritage (CACHe) is a really important part of my role. At CACHe, we curate archaeological collections from the Falls of the Ohio and surrounding Southeast and Midwest. We protect and preserve these important artifacts for future research and exhibits. Many collections were



excavated decades ago and don't meet current standards, so I have hired anthropology students to help revitalize them. We're also working on designing a more robust database. Community engaged scholarship is also an extremely important part of our mission, and multiple anthropology faculty are collaborating on a grant to map the tragically mismanaged Eastern Cemetery and capture stories of living descendants, and students are involved in this work, too. We're also working to repatriate the NAGPRA Native American funerary collections curated at CACHe. Finally, my personal research involves searching for the first Clovis hunter-gatherers in Kentucky. Any students out there interested in curation, database organization, or Paleoindian archaeology, please don't hesitate to reach out!
