### MINUTES OF THE OCTOBER 22, 2021, MEETING OF THE CURRICULUM COMMITTEE

The meeting was convened at 2:00 PM and approved the September 17, 2021, minutes.

Dr. Jason Sievers read the following changes into the minutes from the past month: Updated course description for ANTH 309: Sex, Gender and Culture; Changed credit hours from variable 1/3 to 3 only ART 512: Directed Study in Glass & ART 584: Directed Study in Fiber and Mixed Media Art; Updated notes for ART 351: Introduction to Black and White Photography; Updated course title for ARTH 347: Historic Interiors for Interior Design & SOC 203: Self and Society; Updated course title, semester offered, and updated description for ARTH 541: Theories & Methods in the Visual Arts & ARTH 642: Theories & Methods in the Visual Arts, Removed AH designation b/c the course has not been taught in three years, per Cardinal Core requirements. The department has been made aware of the removal for ENGL 290: Exploring Rhetoric, Writing, and Society; Changed the title and course description for HUM 105: Humanities in Global Cultures - AHD2 & ML 270: Tales of the Chinese Diaspora - AHD2; Renumbered MATH 560 to MATH 360: Statistical Data Analysis - WR; Changed course title to SOC 203: Self and Society.

**008-21F:** The committee decided November 12<sup>th</sup> was the next meeting date and Dr. Jason Sievers will send the committee a doodle pole to find a time.

**009-21F:** The committee discussed defining an online credit hour for the college and tasked Dr. Jason Sievers with reaching out to the A&S Departments and other colleges to gather information on what is already exists. All information will be placed in CardBox under the folder *Online Credit Information*.

010-21F: The committee voted (0 Approve- 7 Against- 0 Abstain) AGAINST suspending the BA in Comparative Humanities. Representatives (Drs. Pamela Beattie and Simona Bertacco) from the Department of Humanities gave a brief explanation of the Department's position on the suspension of the BA in Comparative Humanities and informed the committee the Department voted unanimously to not suspend the degree.

**011-21F:** The committee voted (6 Approve- 1 Against- 0 Abstain) and **APPROVED** suspending the BA in Art History and (7-0-0) **APPROVED** creating a BA in Art with a track in Art History and a track in Studio Art. Representative (Drs. Theresa Berbet, Mary Carothers, and Ying Chan) from the Department of Fine Arts gave a brief explanation of the suspension of the BA in Fine Arts and further explained that with the suspension, they are creating two tracks under the BA in Art. One track is Art History and they other is Studio Art.

012-21F: The committee voted and APPROVED moving the MA in Applied Philosophy from the Graduate School to the Department of Philosophy. Representatives (Drs. John Gibson and Lauren

Freeman) explained to the committee the reasoning and history behind the move of the MA in Applied Philosophy from the Graduate School to the Department of Philosophy.

**013-21F:** The committee voted and **APPROVED** adding a Computational Physics and Data Science track in Physics BS degree program and voted and **APPROVED** the course change for PHYS 565.

**014-21F:** The committee voted and **APPROVED** the change of the GPA minimum from 2.75 to 2.00 for admission into the Liberal Studies program. Dr. Linda Fuselier on behalf of John Hale explained the reason why changing the minimum GPA admission requirement from 2.75 to 2.00 would benefit the Liberal Studies program and the College as a whole.

**015-21F:** The committee voted and **APPROVED** the new course: URBS 303 Quantitative Research Methods in Sustainability and Urban Studies – QR.

**016-21F:** The committee voted and **APPROVED** the course change for SOC 435: Sociology of Health and Illness – CUE. The description of the change is exchanging the prerequisite of SOC 323 to SOC 342 Medical Sociology, so it will read: "SOC 201 and 342, or 9 hours at 300+ level in one social science, or consent of instructor."

017-21F: The committee voted and APPROVED the new courses: ML 261 and SPAN 261 which are cross listed.

**018-21F:** The committee voted and **APPROVED** the new courses: ITP 115 and ASL 115 which are cross listed.

**019-21F:** The committee voted and **APPROVED** moving the vote online for the *proposed new courses*: COMM 215: Communication, *Identity, and Power & COMM 255*: Communication and Statistics as they will need to go to the Cardinal Core Committee. Dr. Jason Sievers will send the committee the vote electronically and will give the results at the next Curriculum meeting on November 12<sup>th</sup>.
