MEETING OF THE CURRICULUM COMMITTEE February 10, 2023 MINUTES

Attendees: *Committee:* Matthew Church, Paul Himes, Laura Moyer, Dana Seay, Jason Sievers, Karl Swinehart, and Li Zeng; *Guests:* Cara Cashon, Christine Ehrick, Gregory Hutcheson, Nicholas Paliewicz, Aaron Rollings, David Swanson, and Kandi Walker

The meeting was convened via MS TEAMS at 2:00 PM and Dr. Jason Sievers introduced Dr. Cara Cashon, Associate Dean of Graduate Studies, where she thanked the Committee for taking on additional responsibilities for selecting the first annual graduate teaching award. In addition, she talked about working with the Graduate School and the Office of Academic Planning and Accountability on a pilot program for accelerated master programs. Her final comments were about having a consistent numbering system for graduate courses.

The February 10th minutes were next approved, and Dr. Jason Sievers informed the Committee of curriculum changes since February 10th (Appendix A).

067-23S – The Committee APPROVED the Department of Mathematics proposal of lower the ACT requirement accepting requirement for College Algebra to 22, but that the dept voted unanimously not to accept KYOTE scores. Dr. David Swanson shared with the Committee the state readiness indicators and informed them that the faculty voted to meet the state indicators.

069-23S – The Committee **APPROVED** the inactivation of the Spanish MA. Dr. Gregory Hutcheson informed the committee that the program does not have the faculty or students. He also discussed how the department will continue to teach the 500- level courses.

070-23S – The Committee **APPROVED** the update to the MPA/CCS dual degree program. Dr. Aaron Rollins informed the committee that the program was increasing the credit hours to the program to 58 credit hours.

073-23S – The Committee **APPROVED** the proposed new course: HIST 307: History of Mass Media. Dr. Christine Ehrick informed the committee that this course has been taught as a special topic course and the department wanted a permanent number. There was discussion on why this course was not cross listed with a course in communication. It was stated that the cross-listing topic will be brought to the Department of History by the Department of Communication later.

074-23S – The Committee **POSTPONED** the proposed new course: POLS 343: Campaign Management until the next meeting to have a representative from Political Science.

075-23S – The Committee **APPROVED** the proposed new Communication Department 3+3 program. Drs. Kandi Walker and Nicholas Paliewicz informed the Committee that the Department of Communication would like to have a 3+3 plan in place for prospective law students interested in Communication.

068-23S – The Committee APPROVED the proposal for making Test Optional Admissions

(TOA) permanent. Dr. Jason Sievers informed the Committee that the test-optional admissions, which was instituted during the pandemic, is in the best interests of both A&S and the university, and the provost's office is looking to make it permanent.

071-23S – The Committee **APPROVED** the proposed university minimum Certificate and Minor credit hours. Dr. Jason Sievers informed the Committee currently there is no credit requirements for both certificate and minor programs. The Unit Curriculum Committee Collective drafted language for the catalog that includes the following limits:

- A **major** shall consist of no fewer than 30 hours of a curriculum designed by faculty of the discipline and approved by the curriculum governance body in the unit of instruction.
- A **minor** shall consist of no fewer than 15 credit hours of a curriculum designed by faculty of the discipline and approved by the curriculum governance body in the unit of instruction.
- A **certificate** shall consist of no fewer than 12 credit hours of a curriculum designed by faculty of the discipline and approved by the curriculum governance body in the unit of instruction.

072-23S – The Committee voted to move the vote for the proposed University First Year Equivalent Course to online. The Committee wanted clarification from the provost's office regarding non-credit bearing activities. Currently, the vote is active online.

Once the Committee was completed with NEW BUSINESS, it proceeded to have a discussion on the additional responsibility from the Dean's office regarding the LEARN pillar in 2023-25 A&S Strategic Plan. It was decided the Committee would draft a response to Julie Wrinn that states the Committee's purpose is a vetting committee and it reviews ideas that are generated, and not a committee that generates ideas. Therefore, the Committee is not able to complete the LEARN pillar in 2023-25 A&S Strategic Plan.
